**Connecticut Yankee**

The issue with regard to the proposed charter for proposed new Connecticut insurance company, as the charter came before the House last week, was not merely whether the capitalization was adequate and adequate. The issue was whether or not the bill represented a legislative attempt to circumvent the law. It is assumed that a charter of the type involved in this particular proposition represents a most valuable property. Secretary Weeks happened to discover, after the issue was brought to him, that the product had been used in the past by the company he was using the product involved very successfully. Evidence is that the product has passed every test ever given it except one—that given by the government itself. It is charged that personnel in the Bureau of Standards, in formulating their own conclusions about the product, consulted with battery manufacturers who were naturally opposed to a product which would cut the need for their own production in half.

### Matt Moriarty Buys UConn Business Block

Matthew Moriarty, Manchester business man, Saturday completed the purchase of a \$500,000 business block on the University of Connecticut campus at Storrs, it was learned today.

The real estate transaction, believed to be one of the largest of its kind ever completed on the university campus, involves a 31-acre tract on which nine establishments are located. There is also additional land available on the property for three more businesses and plans have been drawn for them.

The block passed to Moriarty through his outright purchase of University Commercial, Inc., the block's former owner. The principal stockholders in the corporation, until they were bought out by Moriarty, were Dominick Chertoff, of Framingham, Mass., Emanuel Kaufman, of Boston, Mass., and Albert Gerstein, of Washington, D. C.

Moriarty is now president and chairman of University Commercial, Inc., his wife is listed as secretary, and his daughter, Miss Julie Moriarty, is director at Manchester High School, as vice president.

The block, located on that section of the campus known as South Campus, fronts on Route 100 and includes a grocery store, women's shop, men's shop, drug store, shoe store, beauty shop, barber shop, laundrette and bowling alley.

The additional land on the property is available to complete plans for a bank, theatre and post office.

The nine-store block, another new landmark on the rapidly expanding campus at Storrs, was completed in 1951.

**Reds Blocked Plan**

The western plan, which lays down a suggested disarmament program for the UN Disarmament Commission to consider in its year-round negotiations, was approved last month by the assembly's political committee. The same program was approved in 1952 by the assembly but was stymied in the commission by Russian opposition.

The body is said to be susceptible to 1600 dissidents, all of which we've heard pessimists talk about.

The political committee last month rejected the assembly plan, an alternate Soviet program.

The usual Soviet tactic, after defeat in the committee, is to roll out its defeated resolution and demand that the full assembly reverse the committee decision against it.

This time, however, the Russians asked the assembly only to delete from the western resolution the parts the Soviets had voted against in a paragraph-by-paragraph ballot in the committee, but to leave in the working part ordering the disarmament commission to continue its work toward finding a solution.

For did Vahinsky's amendment make any mention of a rejected Soviet resolution charging the U. S., Britain and France with trying to turn the disarmament commission into a western espionage agency.

This seemingly conciliatory approach surprised western diplomats, but they noted that it contained no indication the Russians would try to push through their own ideas on disarmament when the commission gets back to work.

(Continued From Page One) One Allied spokesman here, long in close contact with the truce talks, said the business-like tone of the Communist message delivered Thursday was "most unusual."

Among UN forces in Korea the Communist move stirred fresh but guarded hope. The South Korean National Assembly unanimously adopted a resolution endorsing any truce which does not deny North and South Korea. The resolution called for a truce which would allow time for another agreement.

The UN spokesman was ready for the meeting in Panmunjom Monday. The Allied liaison group will be headed by Rear Adm. John C. Danahy, a member of the five-man UN truce delegation. Daniel flew here from Japan Wednesday and immediately began a series of conferences.

The Communists have not said who will head their liaison group. There were reports that the other four Allied truce negotiators would return to Munsan next week if the liaison group talks proceed favorably.

The proposals handed over by the Communists at Panmunjom Thursday were in reply to a letter Clark wrote Tuesday suggesting a meeting to discuss plans for exchanging disabled prisoners.

The liaison officers met for only two minutes against a background of Red artillery shells exploding around an Allied camp almost within sight of the conference area.

Prisoner repatriation was the only major unsettled issue when the truce talks were suspended last Oct. 8.

The Allies refuse to return 10,000 of 152,000 Communist prisoners who have said they do not want to go home. Until now the Communists have insisted that all prisoners in Allied stockades be returned.

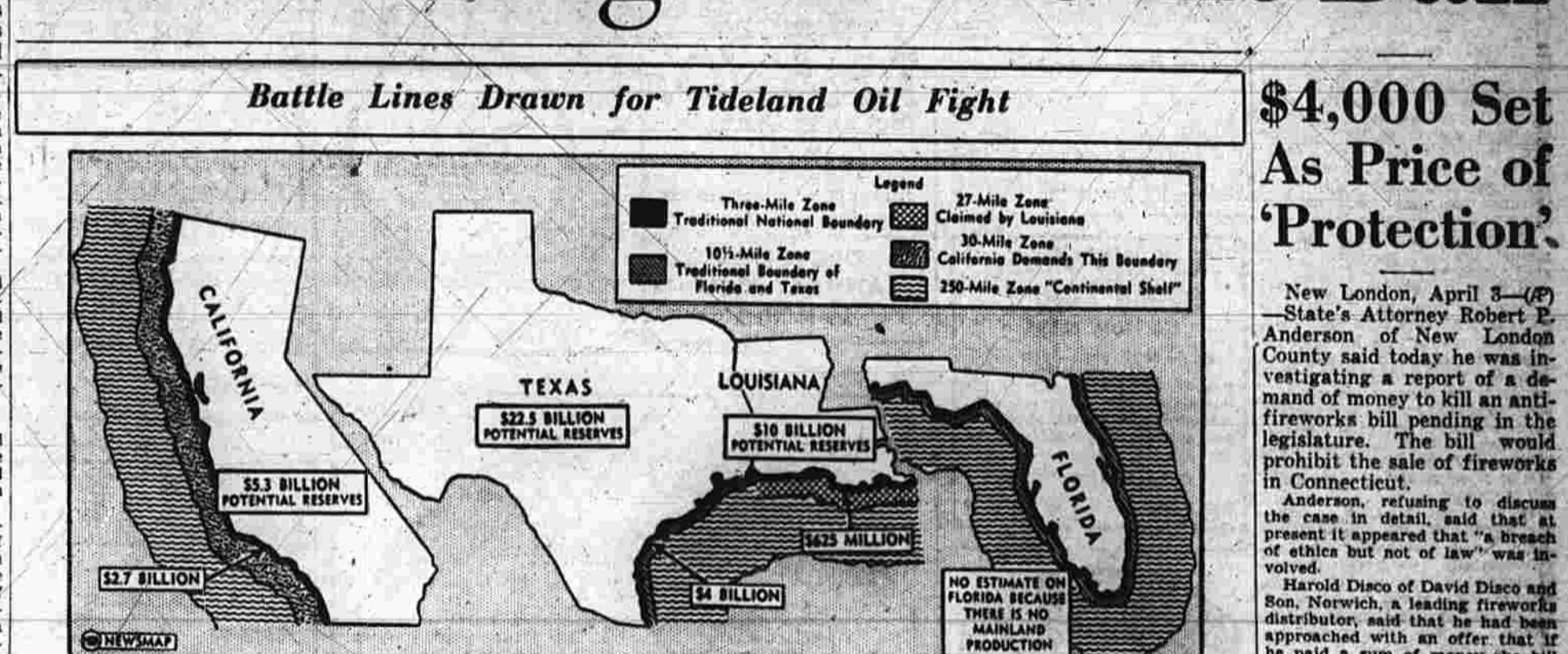
