### Bolton Chief Massolini Hails Idea Of Fire College in Vicinity

Bolton, April 4.—(Special)—Fire Chief Peter Massolini today expressed enthusiasm over a suggestion that volunteer fire departments in both Tolland and Windham Counties form their own fire college for a journey to New Haven, Conn., and require time off from regular employment in order for them to take the fire-fighting course. If the college were located at some central site, fire-fighting courses from both Tolland and Windham County communities, the job of training officer personnel would be made easier.

Massolini said there are several capable fire chiefs and other company officers in the general area who could assume teaching duties. He also said a fine college was favorably received.

He named Howard Reynolds of Eastville, Richard Day of Columbia, and Leo Rivard of Williamstown as chief fire officers. Reynolds is chief of the town fire department and Rivard is president of the Tolland County Firemen's association. Rivard's home station in the present site for the area's relay station and alarm unit through the system are dispatched to all vicinity communities.

The idea of a fire college in this area has been proposed before and much preliminary work would have to be done before plans could be made. It would require much consultation and agreement from all towns in the area. The system and would mean selection of site and training officers.

Massolini's plan is: "It's just an idea, but with the capable men in the various departments, such an idea should be carefully weighed for future consideration."

**Grave Task Ahead**  
 Most country graveyards are depressing places. As one drives along through the smaller towns it is possible to catch a glimpse of the forlorn, upped headstones and rank growth of weeds and grass that sometimes mark early burial sites.  
 The Burrows Hill Cemetery in Hebron, long neglected, has been cited as an example of what ruin and the passage of time can do to a graveyard. It is an interesting bit of ground and contains several graves of more than passing interest. For instance, buried there are Mrs. Joseph Griffling, a bright spirit in the dark days of the Civil War, and Peggy Dow, first wife of the renowned Methodist preacher, Loman Dow.  
 But getting back to Hebron, our correspondent there, Miss Susan Pendleton wrote in a recent dispatch that the Burrows Hill graveyard contains the remains of many Revolutionary War veterans and several "old families."  
 Outstanding perhaps are the two names mentioned before. The epitaph on the stone over Mrs. Griffling's grave contains four words—"Friend of the Slave." There is a story behind that.  
 In Civil War days, a private named Griffling was sent to the front. He was a member of the 5th Maine Cavalry and was in the ranks of the 2nd Maine Cavalry when he was captured by the Confederates.  The grave of Dow's first wife is surrounded with legend and conjecture. Miss Pendleton tells us that the Dow once lived in Hebron for several years in the house now occupied by Henry A. Jones and his family.  
 Among the time-spent stories concerning this grave are those which say the body is buried eight feet deep in a standing position; and that Lorenzo had her white coffin wrapped in "cut after cut of woolen cloth" to prevent decay. It was discovered that not only was the body buried eight feet deep, but the stone was found to be in place.
