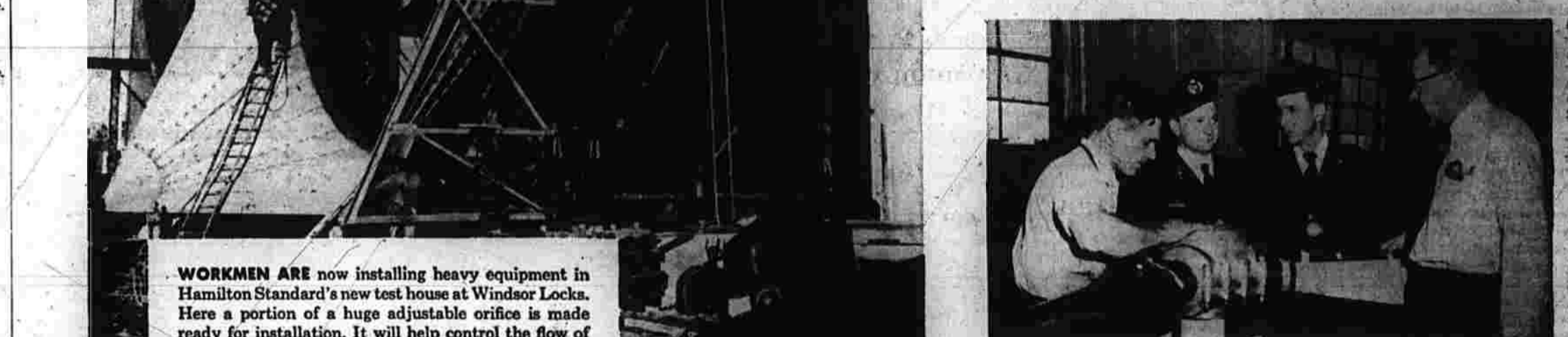

 To date, the Senate investigation
 of the alleged ammunition
 shortage in Korea, far from lay-
 ing to rest the question of
 record and testimony of General
 James A. Van Fleet, has been
 furnishing the material for a
 fairy tale which is being
 taken up and expanded into
 what looks like an unprecedented
 unscrupulous appeal to the
 emotions of opinion among
 Washington officials, civilian and
 Army, on the question of who
 might have been responsible for
 the shortage of ammunition ever
 since, and the allegations of General
 Van Fleet—many times contra-
 dicted by his own testimony—
 reports of the time—that there was
 a period in the Korean war when
 he had a great victory within his
 grasp, but was not allowed to
 take it—all these things are be-
 ing woven into a new fantasy
 which goes like this:

"Trailing inside the United
 States government did not want
 the war in Korea, and one way
 they used for making sure that
 we did not win it was to see that
 our troops in Korea never got am-
 munition enough to win it.

"Accordingly," this grizzly fan-
 tasy continues, "American boys
 have died in Korea because of
 ammunition shortages treacherously
 created by elements inside the
 government. William E. Bunker
 Hunt, who was in Korea to win
 the war in Korea. If, on the
 other hand, the ammunition situa-
 tion had been handled differently,
 and patriotically, we would have
 won complete victory in Korea
 long ago, thus escaping most of
 the American casualties in that
 war."

This fantasy, obviously, is not
 based on any proven fact at any
 point. It is not a proven fact that
 there was ever an ammunition
 shortage in Korea of a proportion
 to hamper the operation of our
 troops there. It is not a proven
 fact that General Van Fleet at
 any time—at the time—pro-
 nounced victory to be within his
 grasp and asked to be "turned
 loose" so he could get it. But on
 these two allegations, both un-
 proven, some commentators are
 now basing the very conclusion
 that traitors somewhere inside
 government were despoiling the
 death of American boys in Korea
 to the end that the war should not
 be won by us.

The purpose of this grizzly fan-
 tasy is to create heartache and
 anguish inside the American peo-
 ple, to make them feel that some
 unspeakable crime has been com-
 mitted against their own sons
 and to stir up an anger in them
 which will demand vengeance on
 human targets not yet designated
 for their final target. Perhaps
 they themselves don't know. Per-
 haps it may be some past civilian
 officials of the Truman admin-
 istration. Perhaps it may be the
 top brass in the Army itself. Per-
 haps they hope that they can fill
 their fantasy, when they make it
 into their standing allegations
 that the State Department was
 and is the mere tool of Commun-
 ist policy. So far everybody is
 suspect, and the allegations and
 interpretations run far beyond
 the contradictory testimony ac-
 tually being given the Senate in-
 vestigation.

There is, as yet, no strong or
 factual reason for believing any of
 this. The only clearly established
 fact in the whole picture is that
 the very same elements who
 once thought they had an in-
 disputable cause when they dis-

puted the use of the word "re-
 turned" in the returned General
 MacArthur—a cause with which
 they hoped to gain control of the
 nation's foreign policy, and in-
 incidentally, the Republican party—
 have now rallied to the opening
 of the door to the return of the
 traitorous testimony of another
 general returned from Korea, and
 are trying to distort history and
 create an anguish from it. They
 ought to reject it, unless and un-
 til such fact supports it.

Lodge Picks House, Shannon as Judges Of Superior Court

Governor Lodge today nominated former Governor James C. Shannon of Bridgeport and Attorney Charles S. House of Manchester, his own legal adviser, to be Superior Court judges. The appointments, climaxing two notable public careers, were the first of eight appointments Governor Lodge is to make to the high court bench.

Shannon was nominated for an eight-year term beginning May 12, succeeding Judge John A. Cornell at Bridgeport, recently advanced to the State Supreme Court. The Governor set July 20 as the date for assumption of his judicial office by Attorney House.
