

Rep. Yates (D-Ill.) said he would offer an amendment to continue the 35,000 authorization into next year.

Even if the House votes to end the program, the Senate may reverse it. The Senate had in recent years favored a more extensive housing program than the House, and prominent Senators are known to want the program kept alive.

**Hotel Fire Drives 100 from Rooms**

Kansas City, April 22—(AP)—An early morning fire badly damaged the Washington Hotel on the edge of the downtown district today, driving an estimated 100 guests from their rooms. No serious injuries were reported.

"As far as I can find out, everything got out," said Fire Director Francis B. Wornall.

"Twenty-one fire cops on a pile a turned out for the fire which burned for more than four hours. Several persons were carried from the hotel by firemen and volunteers.

The 12-room structure, located at 12th and Washington streets, once was the most fashionable family hotel in the city. It was built in the late 1890's.

The U-shaped building is just six blocks from the Kessler Court apartments where a fire April 1 killed seven persons. One section of the structure is five stories; the other four.

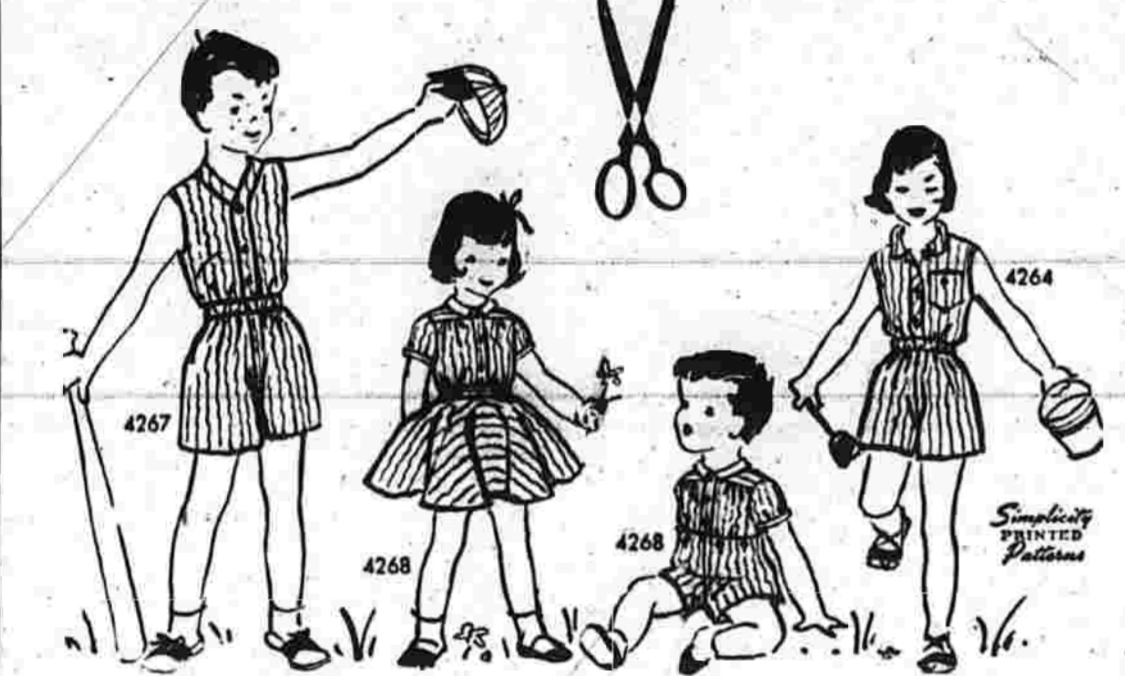

## Rockville-Vernon Trash Collectors to Ignore Converted 50-Gallon Drums

Rockville, April 23 (Special)—Alderman Harry Reed, chairman of the Public Works committee, declared a likelihood that the city might be told to ignore the mayor and members of the Common Council that the 50-gallon converted drums will be ignored during rubbish collections.

Reed's committee came in contact with complaints that men of the PWD had been leaving trash bins. He explained that a ruling clearly states that these converted drums, which are quite heavy, will not be emptied by town employees when filled with rubbish and ashes.

Residents were cautioned to place such materials in lighter containers of small size that can be easily handled by work crews.

Alderman John Oriowski also commented on the need for residents and householders to observe a ruling against placing garbage and cans in the same barrels. The next trash collection will take place May 4.

Mayor Frederick Berger praised the chief's ability and called attention to his contributions of skill and ability with little financial compensation. Brought out was the fact that Friedrich was called recently to five garages in one day and being met by a laughing attitude on the part of those responsible. Berger also praised Fire Marshal John Ash's work for his work in cleaning up surroundings of a business establishment on Village street.

The mayor said Ash's work was due a vote of thanks from the public. He revealed that the city has contracted for a new two-way radio.
