Buganin Asks West Back
Bid for Peace with Deeds

By THOMAS P. WHITNEY
Moscow, May 1.—The Soviet defense minister, Marshal Nikolai A. Bulganin, said in a May Day speech in Red square today there are no signs that the West is jettisoning its arms race or abandoning "war bases" near Soviet territory. He called on western statesmen to back up their peaceful words with deeds.
The Soviet government, he said, believes that "given good will and an intelligent approach all international problems could be solved peacefully." But, he added, insistent that there are no signs of reduction in arms production by western governments nor abandonment of military bases on the territory of European and Asian countries, he said the Soviet Union "our government calls for strengthening of our armed forces."

Peron Talk
Not Halted
By Bombs
Buenos Aires, Argentina, May 1.—(AP)—Seven bomb explosions shook Buenos Aires this May morning. The seventh occurred while President Juan D. Peron was attending the opening of the 87th Argentine Congress and could be heard clearly in the chamber.
All the bombs were set off in small public parks, where damage was minor. The first blast occurred shortly after midnight and the others came at intervals after that.
Police were spaced about 20 yards apart along both sides of the main thoroughfare, Avenida de Mayo, from his residence in Congress for his annual state of the nation address. He made no reference to the explosions but began his speech by loudly applauding his enemies whom he linked to imperialism and the forces that had destroyed the Argentine idea he meant the United States.

It limited sponsorship of these forms of gambling to non-profit groups or volunteer fire departments in the amount of \$100,000 in total in a local referendum. It provided that the games of chance be limited to raffles and bazaars.
The bill originally had a provision that it would not be effective until the state legislature met in its regular session in 1954. But Tony Mokoyans said there was a "strong feeling" that the bill should be passed now.
