How Old Is Your Dog?

By JOE STEWSON
Dog Editor

In today's mail was a letter from a real dog lover. In part it read: "My small mongrel, collie is 19 years old. She has characteristics on her face and I know that the dog must have enjoyed 19 years of tender care and affection to attain this extreme age. I wonder, though, if this owner realizes that in terms of human age the dog is well over a hundred."

For years it has been generally held that one year of a dog's life is equivalent to seven in the life of a human. This multiple is done on a simple manner and makes a fair comparison. It is not as simple as it seems, however, and the early age at which they can reproduce has made me wonder if we can't adjust the multiplier in some simple manner and make a more accurate comparison. It occurred to me that if we double the age of the first year, use the seven until 10, and have 10 for all years after 10 we can arrive at some more comparable stages in the lives of the two species.

Thus if one year of dog would be 14 and at two years 21. At 10 years it would be 70 and from here on we would add half of seven to the next year. A 12-year-old dog would be 84 and a 15-year-old dog would be 105.

There is considerable variation in the life expectancy of dogs and it is different breeds. Surprisingly, that of the smaller breeds is longer than average and of the larger is shorter.
