excusable thing I've ever heard of," Kennedy said. He said that the 193 Western Ally ships were trading with Red China last year—more than half of them British—and that 66 operated in trade between ports behind the Iron Curtain in Europe.

He said the 193 ships made 415 "provable voyages" to Communist Chinese ports last year and that he believed the actual total was about 600 voyages.

Yet 19 firms owning 82 of the ships were nevertheless given charters to haul cargoes from the United States to help rearm the free world, Kennedy said.

Stepping to the witness chair behind Kennedy, a string of speakers from government agencies said they thought steps should be taken to cut off "dual trade."

Arthur G. Bryan, transportation director for the Mutual Security Agency, told McCarthy it is correct that from the beginning of the Korean war up to this moment there has been, as the Senator put it, government policy to "refrain from aiding shipping companies that are aiding the enemy."

Statement Expected
Bryan said he understands a policy pronouncement on the subject is under study now and will come along soon.

"It is long overdue," McCarthy said.

Harrison said no time limit has been set for the armistice talks but he said the conference has delivered a warning that he would end the talks again if the Reds did not begin to produce.

He said that unless these are named these four for propaganda purposes, "we must assume that you consider each of the four to be neutral and competent and therefore suitable."

Harrison continued: "In our sincere effort to achieve an agreement, we are prepared to meet you halfway in the matter of a neutral nation. Although we have previously nominated Switzerland and Sweden we are now prepared to nominate one of the four countries which you have named."



Cheney Union Rejects Proposal by Company

Over 700 Workers File Tinker Hall as Vote Is Reported Unanimous; Supreme Court Next

An overflow crowd of Cheney workers union yesterday turned down a company proposal that the employees accept a wage cut of more than 10 cents an hour and leave to arbitration the question of what to do about an estimated \$125,000 in retroactive wages.

In return, the company would have dropped an appeal which would have prevented the union from taking an arbitrator's award made in January and granting the company a 100-cent-an-hour wage cut to be upheld.

More than 700 workers crowded into Tinker Hall yesterday afternoon to ballot on the proposal. According to observers, their decision was unanimous. About 1,000 workers are in the union.

The workers' rejection leaves to be settled the question of whether the union should accept an arbitrator's award which would be effective Jan. 5. The award, handed down by Professor John Hogan of the University of New Hampshire, granted the company an across-the-board wage cut of one cent an hour.

The union opposed the award. The Cheney Judge Alton said he would take the company's proposal to the Supreme Court.

This morning, Henry R. Mitchell, secretary of the union, said that as far as "I can see now, the award is unchanged."

The nominees of the "Jaybird" primaries were then put on the ballots in the Democratic official primaries, without opposition. The Negroes said the same candidates were then put on the general election ballot, without opposition.

Attorneys for the association said its balloting was "merely a straw vote," which entailed no legal consequences.

But the High Tribunal disagreed. Chief Justice announced the court's decision and wrote an opinion in which Justices Douglas and Burton joined. Justice Clark wrote a separate concurring opinion joining with Chief Justice Vinson and Justices Rehn and Jackson. Justice Frankfurter wrote a separate opinion upholding the claims of the Negroes, but said their proper remedy was in injunction in Texas state courts. Justice Minton wrote a dissenting opinion.
