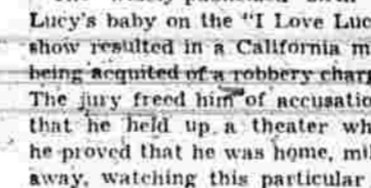

Post Office Hit By GAO Probe Showing Waste

Two baffle plates for \$2.97 by the New York Post Office was supported by nine documents bearing 24 signatures or initials and 20 designations and took four months to process.

Furthermore, the GAO report, unnecessary and costly employee earning statements issued with each paycheck should be abolished. The report added: "Over a million earning statements are issued yearly for the 32,500 rural carriers, and each statement is handled five times during its preparation. The magnitude of this task becomes more apparent when related to the entire postal service of over half a million employees."

There were other examples—page after page of them—which drew criticism from the Comptroller General's accounts. For instance, the report said, the department insists on the same account number for the same account.

It is apparent, the GAO observed, "the Post Office department has a long way to go before its accounting can be considered either adequate or efficient." The GAO asserted, of the existing system: "It does not provide for control of other assets (than cash) for which it is responsible; it does not furnish management with the financial information it needs; it does not fully disclose the department's financial condition or the results of its operations."

After a few months of freedom, he said, "I felt like a flower plant. When you put it in the open after it's been in a pot house, it feels free."

That, he suggested, is the difference between living in Europe and America. Polish-born, Girth said he was captured in a foxhole near a small village north of St. Lo, France, after being slightly wounded in the leg.

A prisoner at Fort Dix for two years, he escaped only two days before he was to be shipped back to Europe. After seven hours' questioning by FBI agents, Girth was booked as a fugitive, to be turned over to the Immigration and Naturalization Service.

Mina Fiorentine, a divorcee with a 13-year-old son, had accompanied Girth here with the boy for a visit to the Statue of Liberty this week end. It was on this trip that her brother got in touch with Girth.

Girth said his "favorite uncle," Hans Wittenberg, a Jew, had been forced to leave Germany by the Nazis shortly before the start of the war, and is now living in this country.

He said he believed the uncle lives in Hartford, Conn., but he wasn't sure because he hadn't tried to contact him. "I didn't want to get them into trouble," he said. "No one could help me."

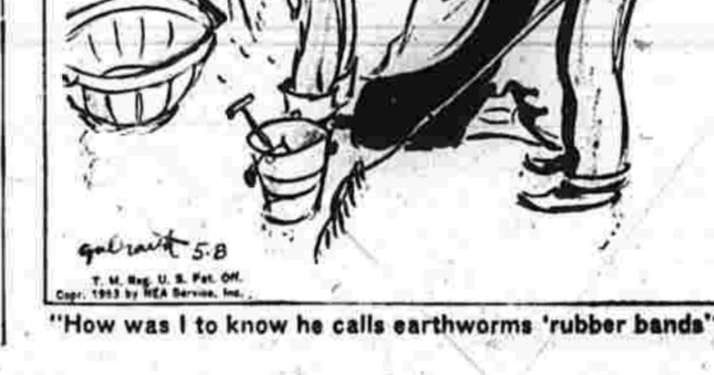

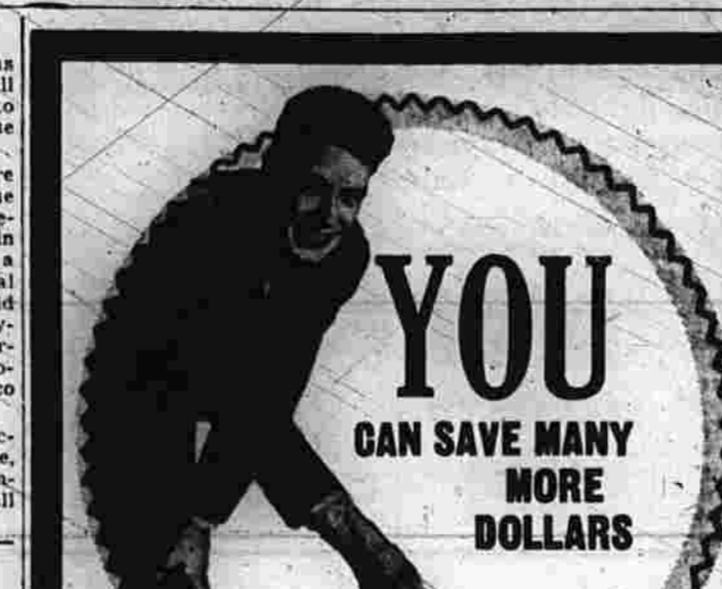

of the spending increases proposed by Truman when he estimated \$18,600,000 in "outgo" for the coming fiscal year.
But yesterday's testimony by Secretary of Defense Wilson that deliveries of military goods to other free nations would "slim" from the present level of \$3,800,000,000 to five billion dollars in the next year gave Taft and other economy advocates little comfort.

The administration sent to Capitol Hill yesterday a defense budget calling for about \$2,400,000,000 less military spending than Truman proposed. That would maintain the level fairly close to this year's estimated rate of \$3 billion.

Rep. Wigglesworth (R-Mass) of a House Appropriations subcommittee said reductions in new appropriations for the Department of Defense would total about \$1,100,000,000. "New appropriations and actual spending differ because the government has on hand billions in funds voted in previous years."
