At the time, there were good military reasons for such decisions on our part. The issue was too hot to go in Korea, our military effort was to try and retain a foothold on the peninsula; we had no time for equipping and training and transporting troops which would be welded into their place in an international army. We were interested in getting to Korea troops, who could take the field of action the moment they got there.

We didn't, therefore, want to be bothered with small contingents from other nations. Perhaps, in a similar situation, we again would have chosen a change of victory over an elaborate creating wide participation in a collective security action.

But, since it was our decision and our policy, it will become American critics of the UN to assert that one proof of its worthlessness is the fact that some members of the UN have done nothing about Korea.

The division of territory in Korea among members of the United Nations supporting the action there has indeed been most uneven. A collective security action should have indeed been more collective. But it was our own military authorities who, for reasons which they have chosen to remain confidential, made the decision which prevented us from becoming more collective.

The Churchill Speech
 Prime Minister Churchill's foreign policy address yesterday reflected British opinion on the evaluation of the present world situation. It is an evaluation which differs considerably from the American evaluation in most respects. It is not quite so dark from the American position in reality.

The sharp contrasts in mood can be found in Mr. Churchill's address to the House of Commons. It is a "supreme" inside Russia as a "supreme" development, in his recommendation that the West, as a whole, should dig in a little soft speaking of a change, and in his own plainly denunciatory attitude.

All this is in contrast to a mixture of mood on the American side of things. President Eisenhower has struck a mood which is very different from Mr. Churchill's. At least, it contains a clean, reasonable willingness to let the idea of good faith live and become as strong as it can. But where President Eisenhower is on one plane, Secretary of State Dulles seems to be estranged to the real progress of these negotiations.

Yet beneath these surface differences of mood, there are elements of similarity between Prime Minister Churchill's position and the American position. He says out loud that the Communist proposals in Korea are reasonable whereas our speech with regard to them plays for time. But it can be judged that it is our intent to accept these proposals, as he would.

Mr. Churchill sees Austria as an issue where progress might be made, and this falls in with American planning. The "invitations" have now gone out for a new meeting of the deputy foreign ministers on the Austrian treaty for May 27.

Mr. Churchill says, as if he thought he were differing from President Eisenhower, that we do not have to get a whole peace package in order to make progress. As we read President Eisenhower's speech, it held exactly the same view, offering the Russians the option of taking a step by step approach from one issue to another.

But in two major respects, Mr. Churchill advances proposals which are certainly far removed from present American intentions. One is his proposal for an immediate meeting of great powers "on the highest level" to investigate the possibilities of contributions to peace.

American policy would rather proceed cautiously step by step, trying to put some of the major elements into effect, before each great power conference. It would rather feel about through existing channels of communication than set up a procedure which would have some of the all or nothing quality Mr. Churchill himself advises against.

Secondly, Mr. Churchill has a specific proposal for settlement of the German problem. He suggests a new type of Locarno pact, one which guarantees Russia against another German attack and also guarantees Germany against a Russian attack. Our first reaction is to go back to the original Locarno pact drawn up in 1925, and also designed to settle the German problem and guarantee European peace. Under it, Britain undertook to guarantee France against a Russian attack, and Germany and Germany

When We Refused Help
 We are glad that somebody in position of prestige and authority has finally set the record straight on the question of why more members of the United Nations have contributed troops to Korea. Of these 18 nations, Korea, 10 are Koreans, five are Americans, with 2,500 Koreans included in each, and three are American divisions.

This situation has led to frequent questioning and complaint that the West, as a whole, is not doing its part in the Korean effort. Many members of the United Nations have expressed their disappointment in this regard.

This complaint was made again Sunday, as a group of members of the United Nations, including Representative Henry Cabot Lodge, Jr., at the UN.

And Lodge gave the accurate answer. "The United States is not doing its part in the Korean effort. Many members of the United Nations have expressed their disappointment in this regard."

It was that our Defense Department turned down the offers of many nations to send troops to Korea.

The Defense Department turned down these offers of troops from other nations, including the United States, on the basis of certain conditions which other nations could not meet. These were that the troops should be American equipped, that these other nations should have no shipping of their own, should provide their transportation to Korea, and that these other nations should be responsible for the logistic support of these troops after they got to Korea.

At the time, there were good military reasons for such decisions on our part. The issue was too hot to go in Korea, our military effort was to try and retain a foothold on the peninsula; we had no time for equipping and training and transporting troops which would be welded into their place in an international army. We were interested in getting to Korea troops, who could take the field of action the moment they got there.

We didn't, therefore, want to be bothered with small contingents from other nations. Perhaps, in a similar situation, we again would have chosen a change of victory over an elaborate creating wide participation in a collective security action.

But, since it was our decision and our policy, it will become American critics of the UN to assert that one proof of its worthlessness is the fact that some members of the UN have done nothing about Korea.

The division of territory in Korea among members of the United Nations supporting the action there has indeed been most uneven. A collective security action should have indeed been more collective. But it was our own military authorities who, for reasons which they have chosen to remain confidential, made the decision which prevented us from becoming more collective.

The slides, which portray these and many other hospital people at work, have been prepared from photographs taken by member hospitals of the Connecticut Hospital Association. They will be exhibited to visitors who come to see their hospital during National Hospital Week, and to boys and girls in high schools who are in the process of choosing their future careers. Hospitals offer an unparalleled opportunity for service to one's neighbor, thus providing a greatly appreciated job satisfaction.
