### Floods Menacing Southwest Areas

**Continued From Page One**

had fought to build up levees so that the next great flood would not engulf their homes, jobs, and businesses.

The raging Sabine, which two days ago swamped Little Deweyville, Texas, a saw mill village of 400 just 20 miles upstream, was still chewing at the dikes, however.

The army of 10,000 men, two days ago, had begun to clear today, just fought harder.

Two levees, battered and begun to break, were being repaired.

One guard, the Gulf coast, had been destroyed last night to cause a strong, swift current that was hurrying away the dikes built by hurriedly called volunteers.

In Lake Charles, two days after the flood heading toward the Gulf of Mexico and white at least, the water sprayed out, inching up and over the residential areas on the east side.

Sheriff H. A. Reid, Jr., said 15,000 persons were driven from their homes. He estimated the damage at 10 million dollars. Lake Charles and its outlying districts total 70,000 population.

The Red Cross took care of more than 1,000 refugees in churches, fraternal homes, and the high school. Most evacuees went to homes of relatives or friends.

The Big Lake Charles Air Force Base, two miles east of the city, was nearly abandoned last night as water zoomed over yesterday at water level, the air force plane base was abandoned and the last runway, some 4,000 feet long, was abandoned. Many planes were destroyed.

Families of military men were hurriedly packed into military camps.

Water was right feet deep in some places and water was over floor boards in barracks.

Sites cleared over storm-stricken areas of the Midwest today as thunderstorms actively headed into the northeastern section of the country.

Tornadoes and strong winds whipped over midwestern areas in the last few days, caused widespread property damage. Heaviest damage was from tornadoes that struck the Michigan-Canadian border area of Port Huron, Mich., and Sarnia, Ont. Five persons were killed.

Thunderstorms hit areas from Dayton, Ohio, eastward to New York City during the night, but abated early today as the storm center moved into New England.

Nearly two inches of rain fell in nine areas. Winds were up to 35 miles per hour, but diminished as the storm dissipated.

Clear and mild weather was reported over the southern half of the country. There was some possibility of thunderstorms in sections of the lower Mississippi Valley during the day.

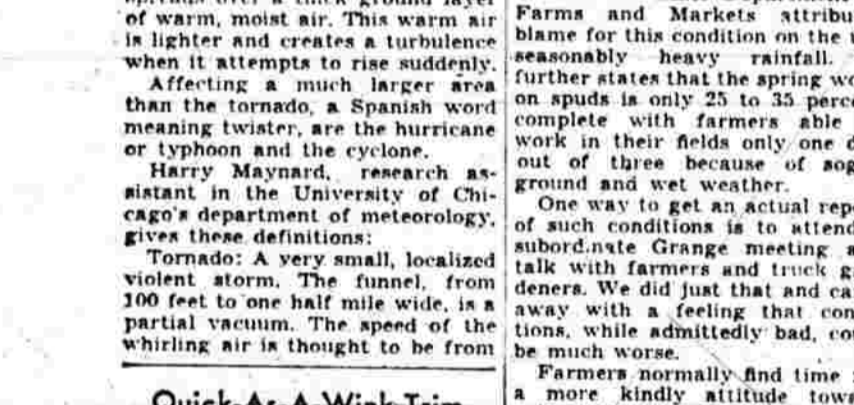
