The Manchester Council of Parent-Teacher Associations has voted to sponsor a Children's Museum for the children of Manchester. The Council hopes to collect and circulate articles of artistic and scientific worth among our schools.

These items will help to enrich the curriculum as well as preserve relics of the early history of Manchester.

Materials will be prepared for circulation and housed for the present in the basement of Waldell School. A PTA member or retired teacher will act as the curator, giving about a half day a week to the project at its beginning.

A full time curator, a building and a year round program are a distant goal. The school truck will deliver and collect exhibits requested by the classrooms weekly.

This activity will be organized and functioned through the Art Department under the general supervision of Miss Hazel P. Latz.

Survey Made A survey has already been made to determine the needs of the elementary classes. As a result of this investigation, it has been decided to concentrate on collecting items most frequently desired.
