Storrs, June 3-Insects are invading Connecticut gardens in great numbers during this time of year, according to observations made by E. C. Minnum, agriculturd extension vegetable specialist, University of Connecticut. ggplants are being attacked by lea beetles, says Minnum. These these vegetables and will also attack turnips and sometimes radshes. Flea beetles can be controlled by spraying or dusting with rotenone or mariate.
Some gardeners have reported out worms at work in their plots r fields. These worms do their seeding at night and burrow into he soil near the plant's stem during early morning hours. Control measures suggested by Minnum

include broadcasting cut worm bait or dusting the soil around the stem of the plant with DDT or Infestations of cabbage worms have been found feeding on some cabbage, cauliflower and broccoli plants in the state, Minnum re-ports. Real Estate Men Require Licenses

Under a new law recently enacted, all persons or firms engaged in the real estate business after Oct. 1, 1953, are required to be li-censed as real estate brokers by the Insurance Commissioner of

Salesmen employed by real estate brokers are also required to be licensed. The law provides for a fee of \$15 per year for a broker's license and \$5 for a salesman's license. Each broker is also required to file a bond of \$2,500 and salesman a bond of \$1,000.
