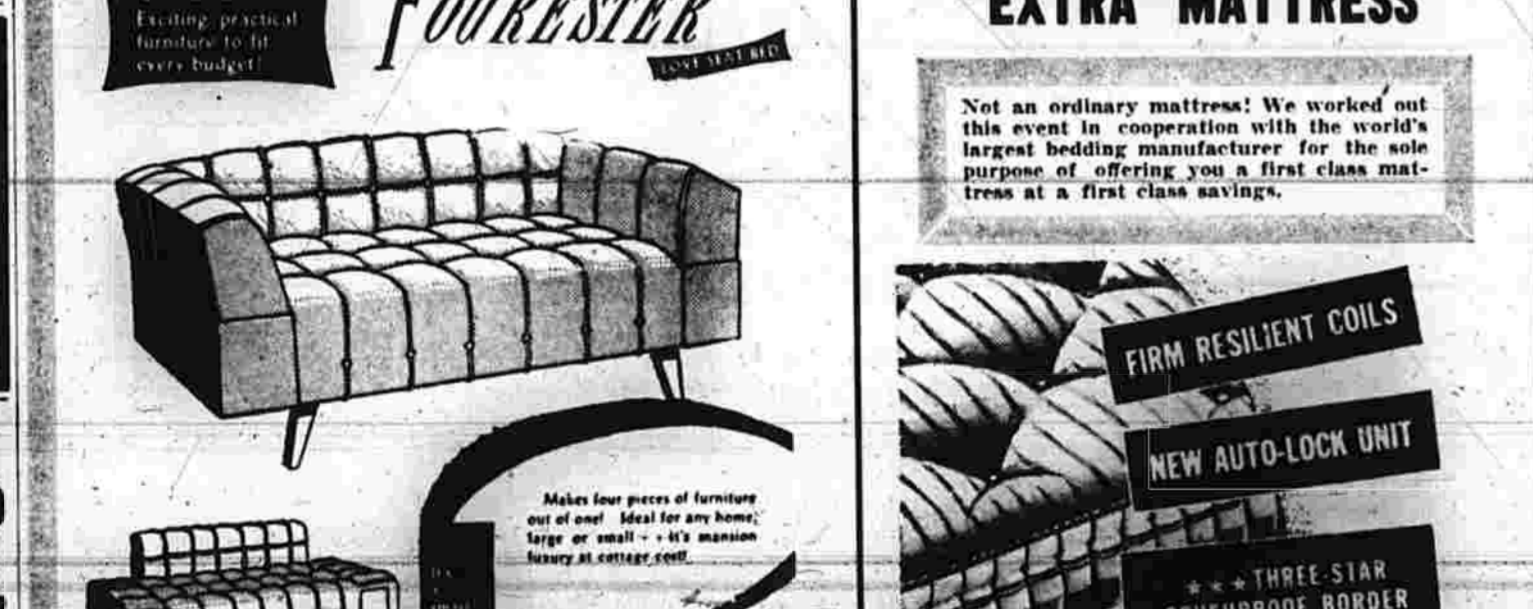

deep displeasure among many of the American people with regard to certain questionable actions and irritating inaction by our Allies. There is no blinking at that fact."

He said he had in mind particularly Western Allies' trade with the Chinese Communists. But he insisted none of these differences "justified any mistaken notion of going it alone."

Such a course, Wiley said, is "totally out of place in the hard, cold, dangerous atomic world of the 20th Century. It is based on blind, wishful thinking of the most perilous sort."

On other points in a foreign policy speech prepared for delivery to the conference of non-governmental organizations, Wiley:

1. Renounced his opposition to a constitutional amendment proposed in Congress by Senator Bricker (R., Ohio) to prohibit the making of treaties and other international agreements which affect U. S. internal laws. "It would gravely jeopardize the role of our chief executive in spearheading American foreign policy," Wiley said.

2. Called for approval of an administrative bill to admit 240,000 alien refugees over and above present immigration quotas.

3. Voiced deep concern over proposed curbs on foreign trade, particularly on imports of residual fuel oil from Venezuela.

4. Endorsed the \$2,400,000,000 administration foreign aid bill, and counseled against drastic cuts in it.

Mother Drowned, Children Rescued

Mrs. Joan Monagle, 25, of the Brighton district, drowned wedged in the driver's seat.

Rescued from a watery death were: Mrs. Amy Norton, 25, also of the Brighton district; Mrs. Norton's two children, Michael, 3, and Brian, 2; Catherine and Joseph, who will be two years old Saturday.

John L. McMay, 31, of Lawrence, the former Coast Guard underwater demolition man, brought three children trapped in the car to the water's surface after repeated dives.

Mrs. Norton and one of the children got out through an open window of the convertible.

McMay later told about the part he played.

"I forewarned my clothes before I hit the water, I didn't want to get snagged in all the debris or on the edge of the car."

"The first time I dove I felt around with my hands but had to come up for air. It was so dark I couldn't see a thing."

"The second time I found one of the children trapped against the back seat. I brought him to the surface and handed him to the other."

"On the next dive I pulled out a lot of debris and then found another child, also pinned in the back part of the car."

McMay said that in another dive he came up with what he thought were two more youngsters but they were dolls which he threw on the river bank.

"While I was getting my wind," McMay continued, "I saw bubbles on the far side of the car. I traced the bubbles and got the third kid out."

"The woman and the others on the shore said there was still one more person in the car so I went down again. I found the woman pinned behind the steering wheel. I couldn't get her out because the car seat had her trapped. I finally pulled the seat out and then got her out too."

"She was in the water, about eight minutes by this time and she already was dead."

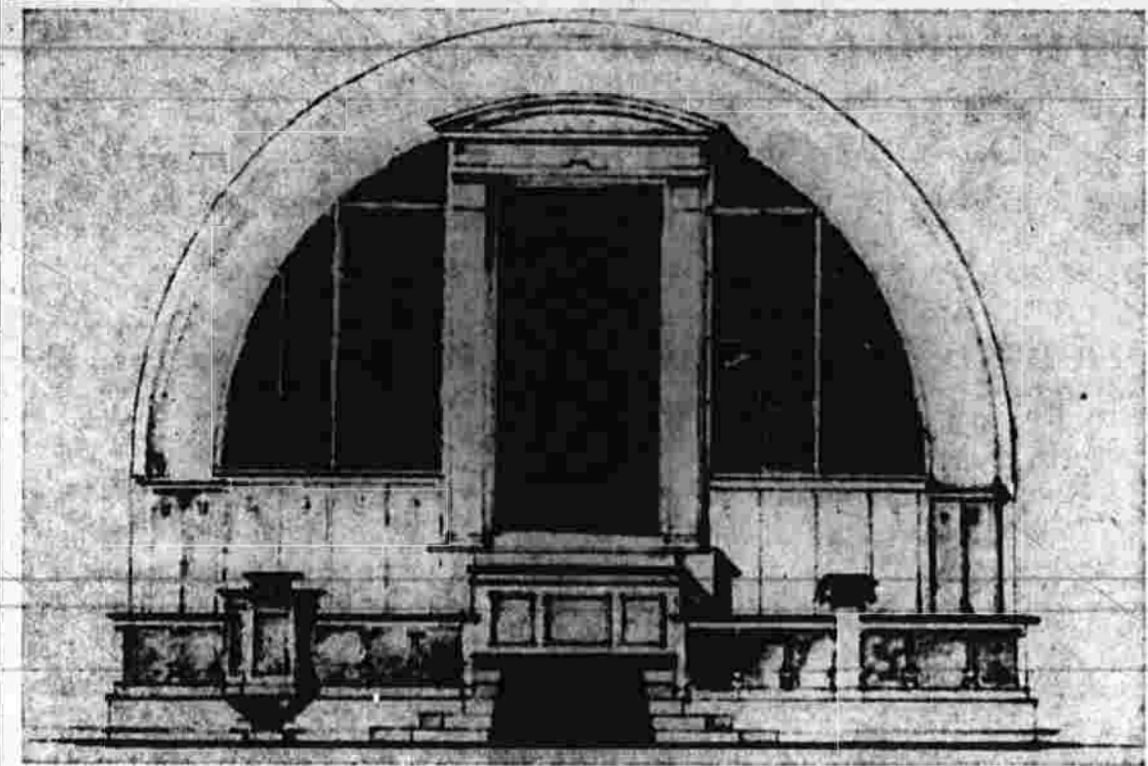

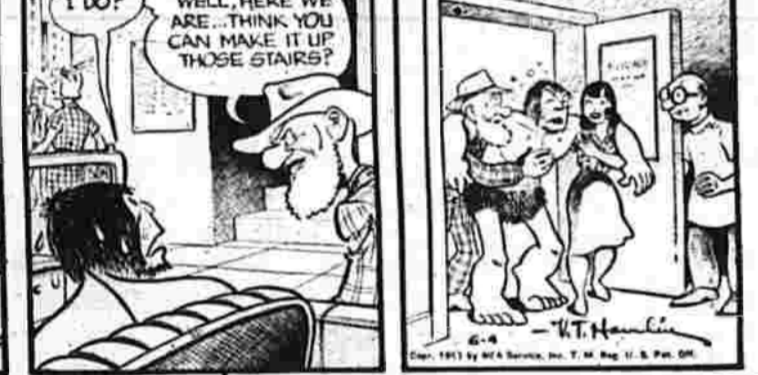
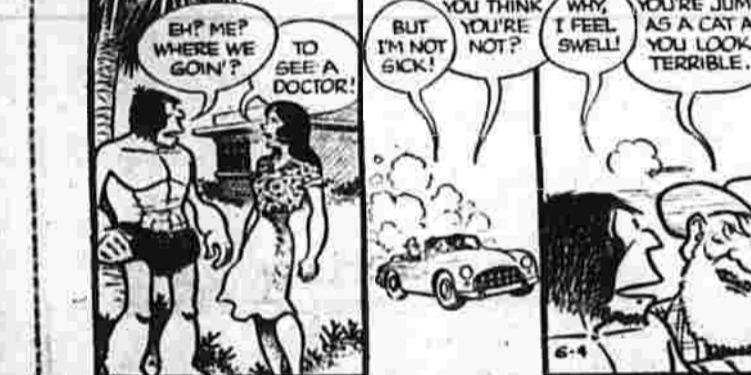
