NOTICE A public hearing will be held by the Town Planning Commission, Friday, June 12, 1953, at 8:00 p. m. in the Auditorium of the Hollister School, to consider the following proposed zoning change and amendments to the Zoning Regulations.

1. Amend ARTICLE IV, SECTION VIII ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS which are stated as follows: (a) Within 1,000 feet in a direct line from any other building or premises in which alcoholic liquors are sold, exchanged or stored for purposes of sale or exchange.

(b) Within 200 feet of any part of a lot used or reserved to be used for a building or premises in which alcoholic liquors are sold, exchanged or stored for purposes of sale or exchange.

(c) In Residence or Industrial zones. Stores chiefly engaged in the sale of groceries which sell beer only under a package store permit shall not be regarded as package stores or as selling alcoholic liquors for the purpose of this section.

These provisions shall not be retroactive, provided, however, that any building or premises used for the sale of alcoholic liquors in contravention of these regulations which is not used for such nonconforming use for a period of 30 days thereafter conform to these regulations.

2. "Name Class of Permit" Defined: A tavern, club, hotel or restaurant shall be deemed to be of the same class and shall be designated as off-premises-consumption outlets.

3. No premises, as defined above, shall be used, erected or altered, for the storage, sale or exchange of alcoholic liquors or beverages either at wholesale or retail.

(a) If said premises are situated in Business Zone I or in any residential or industrial zone, as bounded by Subsection 4) from any front entrance of other premises under the same class of permit, as defined above.

(b) If any front entrance to said premises is situated within 250 feet, as measured in accordance with Subsection 4) from any front entrance of other premises under the same class of permit, as defined above.
