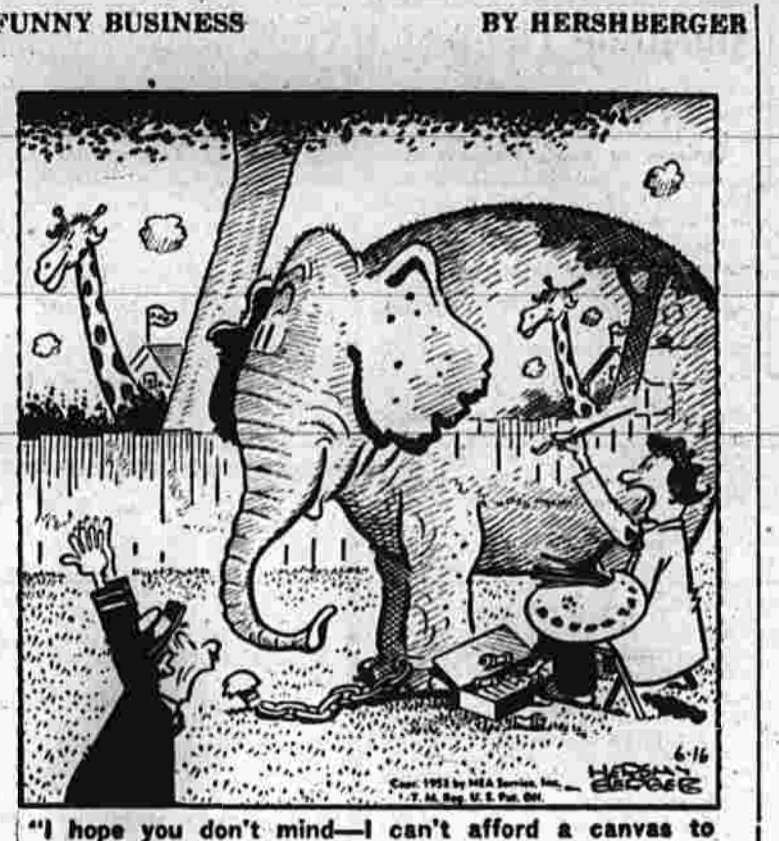

A sidehill lie is the most difficult shot of all.

The ball can be lower or higher than the club head, and it will be in the air for a shorter or longer time. The normal tendency is to hook, to shorten the backswing and aim to the right.

Move the knees a little closer together for better balance, always the toughest problem on this type of lie.

Figuring how to execute any shot is a difficult problem. The ball or sidehill lie, decide what variations you need to make, and then swing in the normal groove.
