GI Passengers Lost in Flames

Tokyo, June 18—(P)—A giant C-24 Globemaster pin-wheeled out of the murky sky near Tokyo today and crashed in flames carrying at least 129 Americans to their deaths in history's worst air disaster. The Air Force said 55 bodies

had been identified. The huge doubledeck transport was carrying 122 Army engineers and airmen back to battle stations in Korea. The plane had a crew of seven, There were no survivors.

The Globemaster crashed seconds after taking off from the U. S. air base at Tachikawa, 25 miles west of Tokyo.

An eyewitness said the giant plane "somersaulted like a bird and plummeted to the ground."
