Washington, June 18.—(AP)—With no specific precedent to guide them, the Supreme Court was making its own rules on procedure today in the historic session on the fate of atom spies Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. There was no way of knowing in advance just what course of action the court could take. Here are the possibilities: 1. A decision on the government's appeal from Justice Douglas's stay of execution could be handed down from the bench as soon as the hearing is ended. 2. The court could confer and issue a decision later in the day. 3. It could defer action indefinitely. Douglas said to last three hours with the prosecution and schedule another session before signing a decision. The court convened at 12:12 p. m. (S.A.P.).

### Bolton Traffic Group Surveys Dangerous Intersection

Bolton, June 18—(Special)—Local interest in highway traffic in the traffic survey made just west of the Silverstein property on Routes 6 and 44-A. A crew of about eight men spent all day and well into the evening hours making the survey for the Highway Traffic Commission.

Cars traveling east were stopped in answer to queries about where they had been and where they were going. In the heavy traffic yesterday not all cars were stopped. Cables laid across the highway from automatic counters were placed east and west of the survey site.

At one point during the day a check of the automatic counter on Route 44-A showed 300 cars had passed in an hour. At least one traffic worker felt the reading—five a minute—supported local apprehension about the heavy traffic on the out-moded highway.

Bolton Hill Intersection For years there has been local concern about the intersection at the foot of Bolton Hill which is just east of yesterday's survey site. With Routes 6 and 44-A running east and west at this point, three roads intersect. Bolton Center road to the south, the old Manchester road to the west and Lake street to the north.

The complex intersection has been the site of numerous accidents and much speculation by residents as to what could be done to improve traffic safety at this point.

Residents of Route 44-A who have been telling each other for at least ten years that the state was going to put a new highway through were doing some wishful thinking yesterday as a result of the traffic survey.

Beyond local benefits, they pointed to the growth of the University of Connecticut and residential growth of Coventry as almost demanding better highway facilities. Local businessmen are reported to feel that the future development of eastern Connecticut requires a modern thoroughfare for ease in reaching areas of concentrated employment.

Field Day Everyone entered into the fun of the annual field day at the school yesterday which took place between 9 a.m. and noon when school was dismissed for the day. 
