New Schools Backed By Voters of Town

Manchester voters went to the polls yesterday and approved the appropriation of \$5,450,000 for the construction of a new Keeney Street School and a new high school with an auditorium to seat 1,300 and the controversial swimming pool.

On the high school, 3,491 yes and 1,286 no. On adding the auditorium to it, 2,787 yes and 1,947 no. The proposal to take the high school to the Keeney Street School across by 3,814 to 1,043.

The high school carried all four districts, with the highest margin in District Four where 1,326 voters approved the project, and 418 opposed it—a margin of more than two to one.

The vote in District One was 667 to 317. In District Two, 805 to 317. In District Three, 860 to 283. Lighter pluralities gave their approval to including an auditorium in the school at all polls.

voters, cast ballots on property qualifications. Under state law a person may vote on certain questions even though he is not a legal voter in the community providing he owns a stated amount of real or personal property.

The widespread misunderstanding that only persons who own property were eligible to vote yesterday caused considerable confusion among residents.

May Be Ready in 1954

It is planned that the high school will be ready for occupancy in September, 1954 at the earliest. Architects Victor Pfeil has been engaged to build a school which will take nine months to complete specifications for the building. Construction could get under way next spring.

12 classrooms including libraries, shops and conference rooms, a gymnasium, an auditorium, one large gymnasium to seat 2,000, two smaller gyms, a tennis court, a cinder track, a swimming pool, two parking lots, a football field, a cinder track, baseball diamond, three softball diamonds, six tennis courts.

The appropriation will be financed, it is expected, on 30 year bonds. A state grant of about \$1,000,000 will reduce the ultimate cost to the taxpayer to about \$7,000,000. Payments on the grant will be made in 20 annual installments.

General Manager Richard Martin has estimated that these mills cost for the 20-year period of the present \$4 million Grand List would cover the \$4,000,000 principal and the interest on it.

Sunder the state grant, it is expected that the school will be ready for occupancy in September, 1954. A reserve fund for future capital improvements covered by the state grant of \$1,000,000 is available for school purposes. General Manager Richard Martin has pointed out on several occasions, however, that the fund is not available for other contemplated capital improvements.

May Reduce Costs

Another source of saving is a possible reduction in actual construction costs from the estimate. Although he has maintained that no material saving could be made with the plans are in the preliminary stages, Victor Pfeil, architect for the school, has said several weeks ago that if the school could be built with a design which might be cut down when final plans are drawn.

Planning for the high school began about a year ago. At that time last few months picked up momentum with the formation of a joint subcommittee on the plans. Represented on the group were the Board of Education, the Board of Directors and the School Building Committee.

The group has held frequent meetings with Pfeil and reported to the parent groups periodically. In addition to engineering, Pfeil, the town has consulted with Seelye, Value, Stevenson and Knicker, a large New York firm of structural engineers.

Designed by Lawrence

The New Kensington School, designed by Arnold Lawrence, an architect, will contain six classrooms, a cafeteria, and an auditorium-gymnasium.

Lawrence has estimated it will cost only \$130,000 to expand the school to 12 rooms, since the utilities are already planned for that number.

The earliest possible occupancy date for that school is September, 1954.

Approximate \$5,619,000

"With yesterday's approval of the two schools, the voters have given their direct approval to a total of \$10,619,000 in four years and four months for the construction of six schools and two additions to schools. They also gave approval to an additional appropriation of \$165,400 which was taken from the capital improvements fund for use on the Wadwell school.

In February, 1949, the electorate approved \$1,650,000 for the Bowers school, and the Venable school. There was virtually no conflict over the appropriations.

Opposition to school appropriations was evident in March, 1950, when voters at a school at Broad street and converting Hollister School into a junior high school met. At that time a referendum was held. At that time the voters gave their approval to a high school on the question—2,182 in favor and 2,097 opposed.

Last June, very slim majorities approved sums totaling \$1,380,000 for the Vernon-Loyal school now under construction, additions to the Bowers and South Schools.

The vote then:

Vernon-Loyal, 1,208 to 1,127; Bowers addition, 1,349 to 1,090; South addition, 1,265 to 1,190. Only 5,200 voted.

Hill Urges Tolls On Roads Built With U. S. Help

(Continued From Page One)

Edward H. Hill, Republican senator from Rhode Island, today urged that the U. S. government should pay tolls on roads built with U. S. money.

The U. S. Congress has authorized the construction of 125-mile expressway between the New York and Rhode Island state lines, paralleling U. S. Route 1.

The entire expressway system would be paid for by the U. S. government, Hill declared, and will require seven toll stations, four of which will be located west of New Haven on a 45-mile stretch where traffic can enter and leave the expressway.

Sixty per cent of the highway Hill asserted, will in effect be toll roads, with only three toll stations between New Haven and the Rhode Island line.

At Hartford, Conn., last night Hill called the federal ban on toll collections "ridiculous."

"My answer to this law is to let the states pay for the roads," Hill said. "I don't think it is fair to let the U. S. government pay for roads which are used by the states and to let the states pay for them."

Hill said a dinner meeting in honor of Warren M. Cromarty, U. S. of Farmington, a State Highway department chief engineer, was held at the Connecticut State hotel, Sunday.
