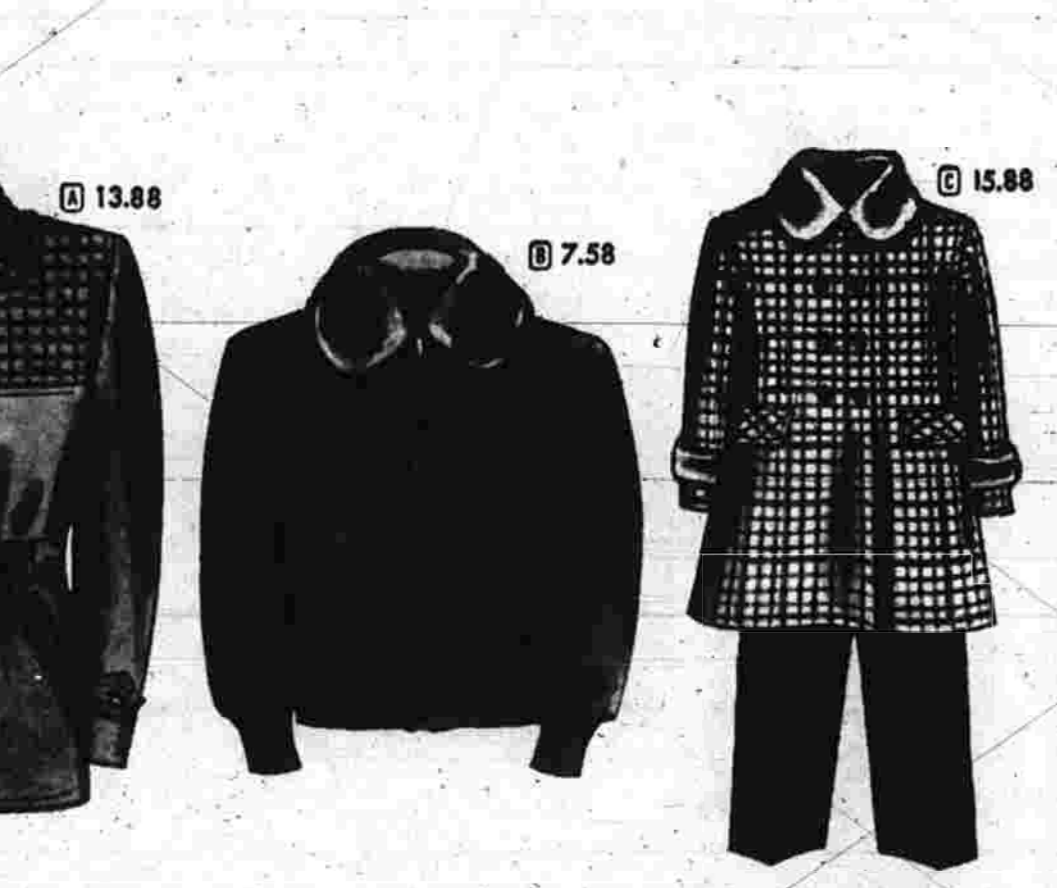

Interpreter For Hitler Finds Peace

Munich, Germany—(AP)—The man who used to be Hitler's official interpreter is now operating a language school—training interpreters.

Paul Schmidt was the "voice of Germany" at every major international conference between 1933 and 1945. He was at Hitler's shoulder every time he talked to foreign diplomats. It was he who turned Hitler's ultimatum into English at the 1933 Munich conference.

Not a Nazi

But Schmidt was not a member of the Nazi party. A professional interpreter, he had worked for the Weimar Republic before Hitler took over.

Consequently, Schmidt was cleared by a denazification court after the war and left free to follow his profession—and to cash in on his close relationship with Hitler.

His school not only teaches languages. It also teaches such subjects as the history, economy and geography of the country whose language is studied, and drills students in technical and business idioms.

Trying Times

He had a few trying years after the war. He was interned in 1945 and held a white while testifying in the trials of Nazi leaders. After his release he was twice re-arrested and threatened with trial. But each time the charges turned out to be based on mistaken identity and he never was tried.

Asked who was the most difficult to interpret, he said: "The hardest man to interpret is the one who has nothing to say."

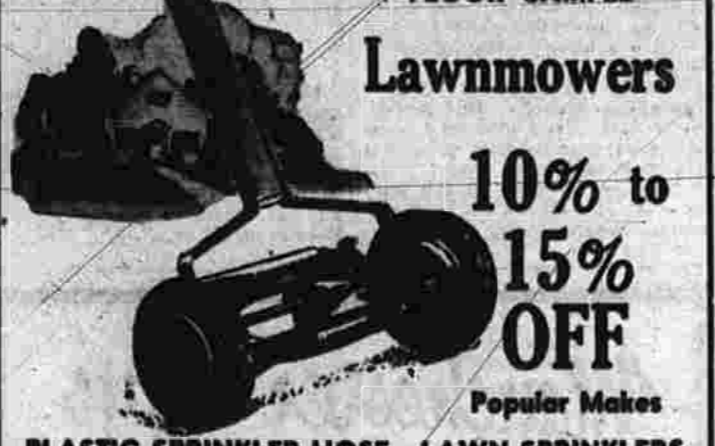

trouble, well, you know you get friends if you're in a gang."
In New York, the pattern is plain. Police Department figures show boys under 18 to be advanced criminals. In the first six months of 1937, the under-18 group committed nine homicides, 31 cases of rape, 185 cases of robbery, 117 of felonious assault, 806 of burglary, 154 of grand larceny and 225 of automobile theft.

In Cleveland, juvenile delinquency statistics haven't risen appreciably, but the techniques of juvenile delinquents have changed. "The kids today," says Capt. Arthur Roth, head of the juvenile crime prevention bureau, "are using more violent arms. Years ago they seldom used brass knuckles or knives, but today they use guns, brass knuckles and knives with more frequency. Their deeds are more violent."

In San Francisco, among the 2000 juveniles arrested during 1937, there was a six-year-old boy charged with burglary and a nine-year-old girl charged with assault with a deadly weapon.

In Chicago, police expect the 1938 total of delinquents—age 10 to 17—to be 22 per cent above the 1937 total. Increases were also noted in Atlanta and Kansas City, Mo., although in the latter city the increase was attributed solely to a population rise.

But there can be no doubt about the nationwide situation. From 1928 to 1937, all major offenses committed by juveniles rose sharply. During the first six months of 1937, there were more serious crimes committed by 16-year-olds than by any other single age group. And, of all persons arrested for any crime last year, 7.8 per cent were 17 or less.

Juvenile delinquency is getting more juvenile and more delinquent doing here only six years after doing it in Atlanta and Kansas City, Mo., although in the latter city the increase was attributed solely to a population rise.

Girl Scout Council Looks Back Proudly on 30 Year Record

Membership Lists 1,400 in 51 Troops

By EMILY SMITH

As the Manchester Girl Scout Council observed its 30th anniversary last month, it could look back proudly over the years to 1908, the year it became an independent council, when it had jurisdiction over four troops with less than 100 members; to the present time when there are 51 active troops with a total of about 1,400 members under its jurisdiction.

Through the tireless and unselfish efforts of many adults through these years, hundreds of Manchester girls have been enabled to be Girl Scouts and to benefit from the program which set up to help make them better homemakers and citizens of the world, through participation in a democratic program and the acquisition of certain skills.

Started here in 1908, Girl Scouting started in Manchester in the fall of 1919, only seven years after the first troop in the United States was organized in Savannah, Ga., by Juliette Low, indicating how rapid was the growth of the new movement.

The first troop, Troop 1, was organized by Miss Julia Buxton of Springfield, Mass., and that time assisted to the pastor of the Center Church, charter members of this first troop were Louise Sharp, Merle Miller, Flora Richardson, Hazel Woodruff, Evelyn Zindel, Vera Griggs, Marjorie Burr, Ruth Hutten and Mary Hemmingsway.

The troop was officially registered at Girl Scout National Headquarters in New York on Feb. 18, 1920, and thus the Girl Scout movement had its first official beginning in Manchester.

Troop 1 has been an active registered troop ever since, making it one of the oldest troops in the United States. During 1920, two other troops were organized: Troop 2 in the spring at the South Methodist Church by Mrs. Robert E. Purinton, and Troop 3 in Novem-

Brownies Do Service Work

The girls who enjoyed the pioneering which membership in an early Girl Scout troop entailed, and a brief account of some of their outstanding events in those days.

Pond Baking Activities

Activities included the raising of funds to buy uniforms and equipment, Troop 3 giving an opera, "Admission Free," and a vaudeville show, the presentation of all troops in the Memorial Day parade, the wearing of the khaki uniforms with the long black or brown cotton stockings, with shoes to match, no blue jeans and comfortable clothing were worn on hikes in those days, but all most appear in full uniform, and the hiking was done in full military fashion.

Other activities included some service work. Troop 3 made 100 washcloths for the Red Cross - a vaudeville show, the presentation of the movie, "The Golden Eagle," attendance at life saving demonstrations and field days. For the first time, in the summer of 1922, Manchester Girl Scouts attended camp, Camp Merritt, then located at Gale Ferry on the Connecticut River.

Brownies Organized in 1925

The first Brownie pack was organized in October, 1925, at the Community Club over North, with Doris McPherson as leader. Troop 3 had been organized in May, 1922, at the portable school on School street at the North End, with Mrs. William E. Shaw, captain and Miss Marie Janney, lieutenant.

At first, during these early years the Manchester troops were under the jurisdiction of the Hartford Girl Scout Council and Manchester officers (leaders) attended training sessions and meetings in Hartford. A provisional council was organized in Manchester during the year 1921 by Miss Marion Tucker.

Form Local Council

In Feb. 1922, Mrs. Joseph Merritt, then commissioner of the Hartford Council, spoke at the School Street Rec. at a meeting held for those interested in Girl Scouting, and it was decided to form a Manchester Council. This council was formally organized in April, but was still under the jurisdiction of the Hartford Council.

with a total budget of \$25, which was paid to the director, Miss Miriam Welles. The camp was held for two weeks, with the members of two or three troops at a time allowed to come to camp for two day periods, including two overnight stays.

A similar camp was conducted the next three years, with Miss Emily Smith as director, first at the Hill property at Manchester Farm, and then in the Welles Farm, Avery street, South Wind.

No camp was held in 1925, but in 1926 and 1927 Camp Sprague, the New Britain Girl Scout established camp, was rented by the Manchester Council for a two and a three week period, respectively, and Mrs. F. S. Paisley served not only as chairman of the camp committee, but also as its director.

In the summer of 1931 the first day camp was held, on R. J. Holt's property at Manchester Green.

mitta, but as director of the established camp as well as treasurer and undertaking for one individual.

Campsite Located
From March 1, 1937 to March 1, 1938, a clearing on the C. E. Wilson property on Lake street was cleared, and in June, 1938, the "old hamlet" on the Lake street on Vernon street was leased for a five year period and the construction of a camp was begun.

The cabin was completed in June, 1940, and a day camp was run at this site for the next two years with former Manchester Scouts and Golden Eagle service boys in charge. Miss Louise Burr and Miss Jeanette Pitkin.

No day camp was held during the years 1942 through 1945, due to the difficulties of getting transportation during the war, but the camp was reopened in 1946 for a five week period with Mrs. Peggy Woodruff Mortuary serving as camp director.

Receptive Deed to Land

Self-Care of Athlete's Feet Should Stop at Foot Powder

 Each summer a large number of people become afflicted with a peculiar condition of the skin, usually known as ringworm, athlete's foot or dermatophytosis. Dermatophytes may take various forms such as itching, scaling, cracking, bumps or callosity-like lesions of the skin. It is common.
