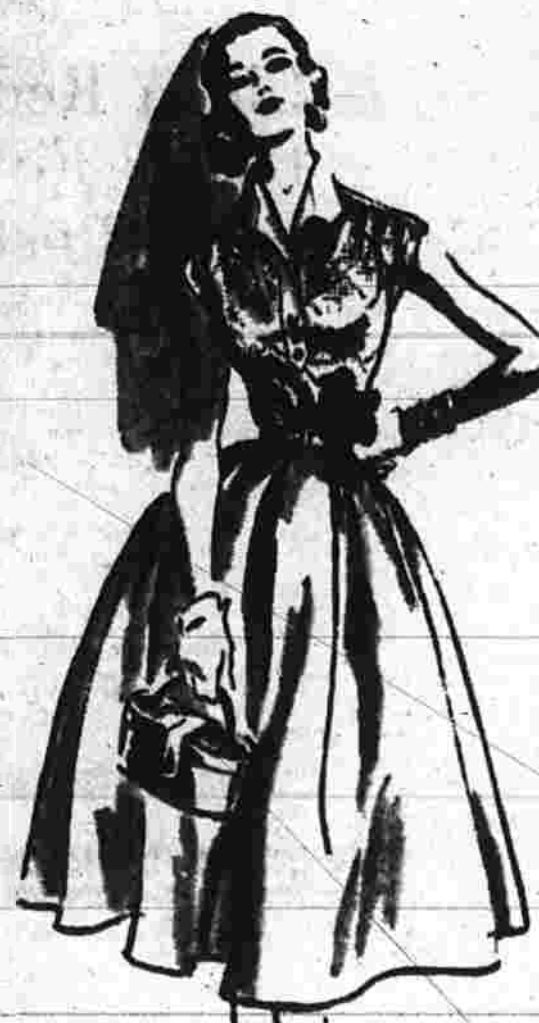

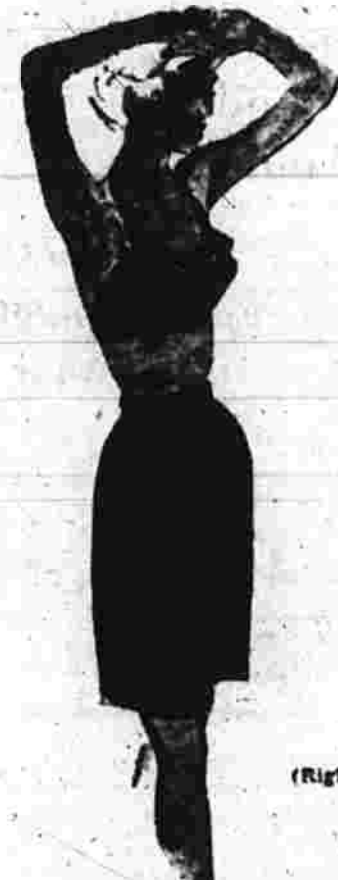

Wapping Voters Will Decide On School Budget

Wapping, July 22 (Special)—During a special town meeting tonight at 8 at the Town Hall the voters will be asked to appropriate an additional \$200 to the elementary school budget for the fiscal year 1953-54. This money is chiefly needed by the new Wapping Grammar School for utility expenses.

Also the voters will consider the matter of electing or appointing members of the Zoning Board of Appeals in the October election. The third item concerns discontinuing capital and non-recurring expense funds in accordance with Section 501 of the 1949 revision of the General Statutes, and transfer of the assets to the General Fund of the town.

Coventry New Pupil Registration Set; Hold Dental, Visual Clinics

Coventry, July 22 (Special)—Registration of new pupils entering the Coventry School System will be held at 8 and 9 at the Robert A. Roberts School office. Parents who bring their children to the dental and visual clinics can register their children during the time of their appointments in the school building.

All other children entering Grade 1 or other classes in the fall are requested by Principal Royal O. Fisher to register at that time. Mrs. Dudley Brand, chairman of the Young Mothers Club, said Tuesday only about 30 out of a possible 90 appointments for the dental and vision clinics have been made.

The dental clinic will include examination, cleaning, and the first four fluoride treatments. Miss Martha Elash, R.N., of the Bureau of Mental and Child Hygiene, State Department of Health, will conduct the vision clinic. Each day 30 children will be accommodated in each of the two clinics. All 60 of the dental appointments on August 11, 18, and 25 will receive fluoride treatments.

A new clinic for hearing examinations has been arranged by the Young Mothers club through the State Department of Health on August 18 and 25 from 9:30 a. m. to noon and from 1 p. m. to 2 p. m. Children participating in the dental and vision clinic may make new appointments at their respective clinic examinations. All clinics are free.

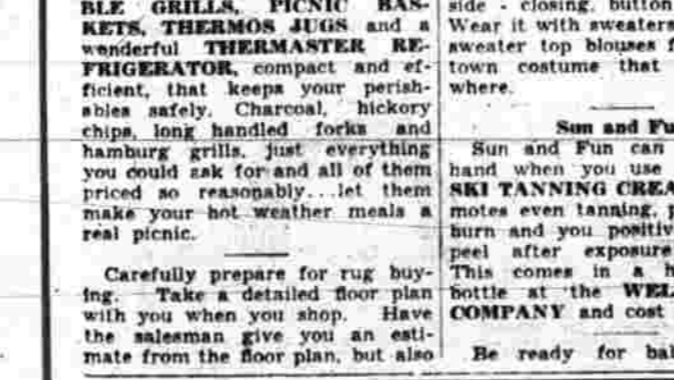

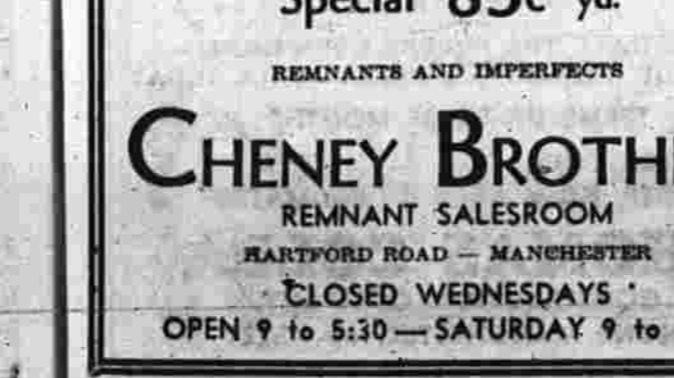
