Vienna, Austria, Aug. 18 (P)—Edgar Sanders, the British businessman who was jailed in Red Hungary nearly four years as a spy, was released and put over the Austrian border today at Nickelsdorf. A former associate of American businessman Robert A. Vogeler, Sanders said he was subjected to severe "mental pressures" but was not physically tortured before his trial in 1950. Vogier was released in April 1951, after serving more than a year on the spy charges. Although Sanders spent 3 years and 9 months in jail compared to Vogeler's 17 months, he appeared in far better shape than Vogelar.
