ed and thought that the Americans would not fight. The Korean fighting has established, he said, "aggression by the free world can not be enlarged by the aggressors until they become bloated with power and busy with success."

Aggressors, he cautioned, in cautioning against possible Communist aggression against South Korea. Dulles noted that the United States and its 15 United Nations allies in Korea have jointly declared that any violation of the armistice would be treated as an act of aggression against the United States.

Dulles made it clear that the United States would be willing to talk about Indochina, if the Communists desire it, at the Korean peace conference.

Dulles chided the United Nations for paying what he termed too little attention to South Korea's views in last week's debate on the maintenance of the U.N. peace delegation.

ment of the church's position today.

At yesterday's hearing 18 witnesses were questioned. Mr. McCarthy gave newsmen some details of the hearing but did not identify the witnesses by name.

The Senator said the guard worked for the Army Signal Corps in New York and had access to the highly classified film which he was supposed to guard against unauthorized persons.

McCarthy did not say whether any film had been stolen or tampered with.

A woman witness, according to McCarthy, was described by a male witness as high enough in the Communist party to give orders to a National Committee member and earn the nickname of "Mrs. Communist."

The Senator quoted "Mrs. Communist" as admitting she was a member of the Communist party in the 1930s. He said she refused to say whether she was a party member, invoking the constitutional immunity from possible self-incrimination.

"Mrs. Communist" was described by the witness, McCarthy said, as the party boss of a woman Army worker.

In Washington yesterday the Army said it had no authority to limit over personal files to the McCarthy subpoena.

A trio of Army officers had testified at yesterday's hearing and were asked for personal files and the names of individuals who gave loyalty clearances to certain civilian employees of the Army. The officers replied that they needed permission from their superiors and the Secretary of Defense before supplying the data.

The Army spokesman in Washington said that existing regulations were designed to protect the confidential nature of personnel records and were based on an executive order issued in 1948 by former President Truman.

However, an official in the office of the Defense Department general counsel said the Pentagon would make no decision on the McCarthy request until the issues have been studied in the light of developments since the original order was issued five years ago.

have been forced to slow almost to their lowest safe speed in order not to outrace the KC-135s during refueling.

In refueling from a KC-107, the tanker lowers a telescoping flexible "flying boom" which an operator in the tanker maneuvers into an opening in the nose of the B-47.

But in refueling from the new tanker, designated the KC-137, the receiving airplane has a long, streamlined refueling probe jutting from its nose. This probe is maneuvered by the B-47 receiving the fuel into a "drogue" or recep-

Reds Release 300, Lowest Quota Yet

waiting Red Cross teams. The announcement, which was made by an Australian officer, said the Reds told him they would not be repatriated unless he gave "proper answers" to Red Cross workers.

Smiling and apparently in good health, 41 officers and 19 sergeants made up the 100 Americans returned Wednesday. They brought 3,027 of the number of Americans freed so far. The Reds held up delivery of the Americans until after 150 South Koreans were returned.

In all, the Communists turned back 100 Americans and 200 South Koreans Wednesday and promised to deliver Thursday 50 Americans, 200 Koreans, 5 British and 6 Canadians.

Including Wednesday's delivery, 11,716 Allied prisoners have been freed. Before the exchange started, the Reds said they held 12,782 POWs, but have since indicated they would return more than that number. They said they would include an undisclosed number of men captured in the last days of the war.

According to the original Red figure, 286 Americans are yet to be returned, but this number probably will be exceeded.

One of the Americans returned Wednesday learned for the first time that he had won the nation's highest award—the Congressional Medal of Honor—for bravery the night he was captured two years ago.

He is Lt. James L. Stone of Hot Springs, Ark., who was told of the award by Brig. Gen. Ralph Caborn, 8th army officer in charge of repatriation.

His voice choked with emotion, Stone told the general, "I don't know what to say. I don't think I deserve that. I don't think I should have it."

Stone was captured Nov. 23, 1951 during a night in which he led his platoon in attacking Chinese. Although wounded, he stood fast with his men until he lost consciousness.

Lt. William H. Whitledge of Seattle brought back the report that 75 Americans who "confessed" to germ warfare were awaiting repatriation at Keasong.

Whitledge said he and his fellow broadcasts and signed statements

with him for two years said "Slick" sold out to the Communists for better treatment by informing on fellow POWs.

The U. N. Command statement accusing the Reds of "rigging" interviews was issued by the Allied Military Armistice Commission today. The statement said Communist members of the commission "used the same methods of rigging interviews between U. N. prisoners and Red Cross teams visiting their detention camps came to light today."

"In the avowal of a returned Australian filer that he had been imprisoned," the statement said, "Flight Officer Ronald D. Guthrie said at camp Britania that the processing center for returned Commonwealth POWs that during the more than two years of his captivity I never saw an R. F. P. M."

Army authorities said "Slick" had been absent without leave for five days and military police had been ordered to arrest him.

"Slick" originally had been scheduled to leave for the U. S. on a troopship from Inchon after his repatriation, but he reportedly was warned that other prisoners had "voiced vengeance."

He asked to see an Army chaplain. The chaplain called in medical officers and "Slick" was sent to the Tokyo hospital.

The bill also provides that the publisher could collect for the paper through legal means without paying court fees.

Crop Loss at Five Million In New England Heat Belt

(Continued from Page One)

Walter Piper, State Marketing Specialist, said the bottom has fallen out of the market because in order to cut losses, growers are dumping their produce, prematurely ripened and stunted.

"Gardeners report that they cannot give away good quality produce," he said.

A check of New England agriculture officials indicated Massachusetts has suffered most from the prolonged heat and lack of rain.

Only 1.51 inches of rain fell in the state during August, compared with the normal of three inches.

Commissioner Broderick said farmers throughout the state are operating irrigation systems 24 hours a day or else hauling water for stock. Pastures have withered and farmers are using winter feeds of hay and grain to feed their stock.

The Cape Cod cranberry crop is expected to reach a record size this year, also has suffered.

The situation was less serious in other states.

In Connecticut, many farmers were irrigating their fields but the drought situation there was not thought critical.

Rhode Island agriculture was in no particular trouble, and in New Hampshire, Agriculture Commissioner Perry I. Ritts said "some farmers may be worrying about their work drying up" but there shouldn't be any worry yet about crops.

Southern Vermont was short of water and an official at Rutland said eight might have to be obtained from other sources if no rain falls within 48 hours to raise the level of the reservoir there. Officials asked householders in the area to use water only when necessary.

In Maine, Agriculture Commissioner Fred Nutter reported crop conditions generally favorable. He said corn was ripening fast and potatoes growing in the heat.

Elsewhere in the nation, the damage from the summer's unseasonable weather, with no heavy rains in many areas, was widespread.

The death toll from causes attributed to the current heat wave mounted to at least 90, thousands have been treated for heat prostration.

Damage to crops in several states appeared soaring into the millions of dollars. In Missouri alone, officials estimated the farm income loss from drought would total 100 million dollars.

Most of the major cities in the

eastern half of the country have now records for consecutive days of high temperature and readings for the date for the last several days.

It was 102 in Cincinnati yesterday; 100 in Indianapolis and Nashville; 98 in Philadelphia and Columbia, Ohio; 98 in Milwaukee and Detroit; 97 in Philadelphia, Kansas City, Des Moines, Pittsburgh and Omaha. New York's 93 was a record for the date and the eighth straight day above 90.

West Virginia is suffering the worst drought since the early 1930's. Agriculture Commissioner J. R. McLaughlin said the corn crop is "ruined," and there is little hope for wheat, rye and barley crops next spring. Cattle prices were 50 per cent lower than last year.

Southern Missouri was reported suffering its worst drought on record and for the state the summer has been the hottest and drier, also the record-breaking year of 1934. Pastures were reported virtually "non-existent" in Missouri.

L. C. Carpenter, Missouri Agriculture Commissioner, said the big lossers from the drought would be the livestock raisers. He said rain must come in quantity by mid-September if any fall pasture crops are to be saved.

In Illinois, millions were inconvenienced by lack of water as overhauled pumps broke down. The shifting heat in office and factories brought early closing in many cities again yesterday.

The hottest cities yesterday were Louisville and Jackson, Miss., with 103 while Chicago's 101 marked the eighth day of temperatures above 95. It also was 101 in Cleveland, two degrees above the city's hottest day in history.

In Ohio, two members of the American Legion collapsed and died during the 10-hour parade at the heat there Sept. 2 in Chicago.

Of the 50 deaths attributed to the heat, there were 32 in Chicago in a 12-hour period yesterday, the hottest Sept. 1 on record.

The death toll in Illinois was 14. Seventeen persons died in Pennsylvania from heat exhaustion or heart conditions aggravated by hot weather. There were six in New York; three in Texas; two in Michigan, Missouri and Wisconsin; and one each in Ohio, Maine, Wisconsin and Maryland.

Corn and soybeans have been scorched and are being pulled out in Illinois with the loss expected to run into the millions. One 5-county area in northwestern Illi-

noia is believed to have suffered damage of nearly 13 million dollars in its corn crop alone. Most of the state has had no heavy rain since Aug. 18.

Flowing for winter wheat has been virtually halted in Indiana because of the dry soil. Corn and soybeans have been damaged and dry pastures have forced farmers to market cattle early.

In New York state, the prolonged hot weather has ripened fruits and vegetables prematurely, cluttering the markets and forcing prices down. Pastures are dry in dairy areas. Many upstate communities reported water shortages. The state's highest temperature during the heat wave was 100 at Poughkeepsie and at La Grange Field in New York City. The top reading yesterday was 98 at Poughkeepsie.

Texas has had no heat wave this summer—just normal hot weather. But because of the severe drought, little or no rain—many cities "survived" water shortages. Drought has hit cattlemen and farmers in the 150-county drought disaster area and the federal drought relief program is still in effect.

State agriculture officials in Michigan said rain is needed within the next few days to prevent serious damage to the fast ripening fruit and vine crops. Potato growers have given up on the season's forecast of a 1943 bumper crop.

Federal and state crop observers in Maryland said farm crops are "bearing up well" under the heat wave. But more rain is needed in some western counties for corn and pastures and late varieties apple crop.

In Maine, Agriculture Commissioner Fred J. Nutter said that effects of the heat wave on farm production thus far have been favorable—with corn ripening fast and potatoes in good shape.

Crop conditions in most of the Southeast were reported in normal condition although drought conditions threatened in some areas.

The hot weather has affected crops in North Carolina but drought has caused the heaviest damage. Crops hardest hit are corn and soybeans, while livestock conditions are poor. Between 30 and 40 per cent of a state has been scorched and is being pulled out in the northwestern part of the state.

In Western states, not affected

by the summer's searing heat, crop conditions were reported generally normal, as have been temperatures for the most part during the summer. States include California, Arizona, Idaho, Utah, New Mexico, Montana, Colorado, Oregon, Washington, Wyoming, and Nevada. The Weather Bureau in Reno
