activity to rush several and prevent accumulation of troops. To speed the work, Route 1-A was closed from the Boston line to a point a half-mile over the Revere line.

The Boston Police Fireboat Luna was ordered to Chelsea Creek to help flush the fuel into the harbor and additional fire companies were moved into the area. Police were ordered on extra duty in anticipation of fire.

On August 5, five miles from the Italian border, President Tito of Yugoslavia formally disavowed any intent to annex Zone "B" with the same comment: "Why should we do it? We already have it."

Instead, he proposed the Port of Trieste itself be internationally administered with the surrounding territory turned over to Yugoslavia.

In an exchange of notes with Italy, Yugoslavia warned that "if the Yugoslav government establishes that the Italian government continues to adhere to the abnormal situation on the border, it will be forced to undertake in its territory corresponding measures."

Tito issued a threat in his speech Sunday. Tito said that "we shall never send divisions before we see that an opponent might really try to attack our territory... We are not going to rattle our arms although we are not afraid of arms, but on contrary love them."

Yugoslavia's position may become clearer this weekend. Tito is scheduled to make a major speech in the Adriatic port of Trieste on the 10th anniversary of the formation of Yugoslavia's 1st Army Corps.

Italy's Premier Giuseppe Pella is expected to speak on Monday, answering for his government the speech made Sunday by Tito. He is expected to speak to the Italian Parliament, elected in 1950, formally ended its last session.

Formerly a statement came July 29, that the Italian government had approved a new law of criminal procedure, modifying the practices and giving offenders accused of political and civil crimes a better protection than previously.

It also approved a resolution recommending that all cities, towns and state enterprises refrain from the post-war practice of naming streets and factories after Yugoslavians present leaders. Tito was specifically exempted from the recommendation after a president (Edward Kardelj) said his name had become a symbol of the revolution against Yugoslavia's request from Bulgaria to send a new ambassador to Yugoslavia.

Bulgaria has not been represented by an ambassador since 1950 after the break between Yugoslavia and the Russian-led Communist bloc.

The Foreign Office Information Bureau identified the Bulgarian appointee only as Angelov Ljuben.

come a practicable objective." He continued:

"Convertibility requires a willingness to permit considerably more free competition than is the normal practice today, not only with other exports in foreign markets, but also with imports in domestic markets."

"What the great creditor countries, and particularly the United States, do about their foreign economic policies is highly important for currency convertibility."

Fund Offers Advice

The Fund advised European nations to look to Western Hemisphere countries other than the United States, Mexico and Canada, Cuba, Mexico and Venezuela, which present no barriers to convertibility, the report said, and all have dollars available because of heavy U. S. defense buying in the West.

Meanwhile the World Bank, which is holding the annual session jointly with the Fund, approached a showdown with its last Iron Curtain member, Czechoslovakia.

The Bank's Committee on Finance and Organization last year suspended from membership on Dec. 31 unless the Czech government had paid by then the sum it owed the bank.

The Czechs still owe \$625,000 of the \$1.5 million loan to the bank, which they pledged seven years ago.

When a country is suspended from either the Bank or Fund it is automatically expelled within another year if it does not correct the conditions which caused the suspension. The Bank's governors will consider the Czech suspension on Saturday, final day of the meeting.

Czechoslovakia is also in trouble with the Fund. The country recently revealed its currency without consulting the Fund, a violation of the Fund's basic charter. It also withdrew some of the currency which had been placed on deposit in Czechoslovakia for the Fund's account.

Czechoslovakia has notified the Fund within the last day or two. It was learned that the money would be returned to the Fund's account. This still leaves unsettled the issue of convertibility, but officials on the Fund and Bank are reluctant to make a complete break which would sever the last ties of the institutions with the Soviet sphere. The Czechs could keep their membership in the Fund even if they lost membership in the Bank.

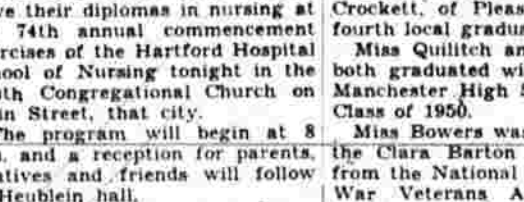

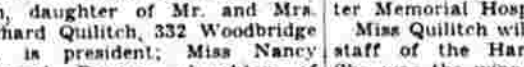

Hong Kong this afternoon and was immediately tied in a closed portion of the Navy dockyard. Newsman and photographers were barred from the area and the Navy issued no statement.

The light official secrecy has created speculation that the shooting might have important political implications, but most maritime observers said the shooting apparently was unpremeditated and resulted from Communist suspicion of all foreign craft.

The Reds have opened fire on numerous craft, large and small, in the past, but Communist shells took by far their heaviest toll this time.

In London the Admiralty identified the damaged craft as the 72-foot launch 1323. It was understood the craft, which normally carried a crew of two officers and 12 men, was on a normal patrol at the time of the shooting.

Presumably the rest of the men aboard the launch were rescued.

The Navy said the launch occurred at 3:10 p.m. Hong Kong time (2:10 a.m. D.E.T.) yesterday in international waters seven miles southwest of Lin Tin Island. This is south of Hong Kong and on the east side of the Pearl River estuary leading to the Communist Chinese port of Poochow.

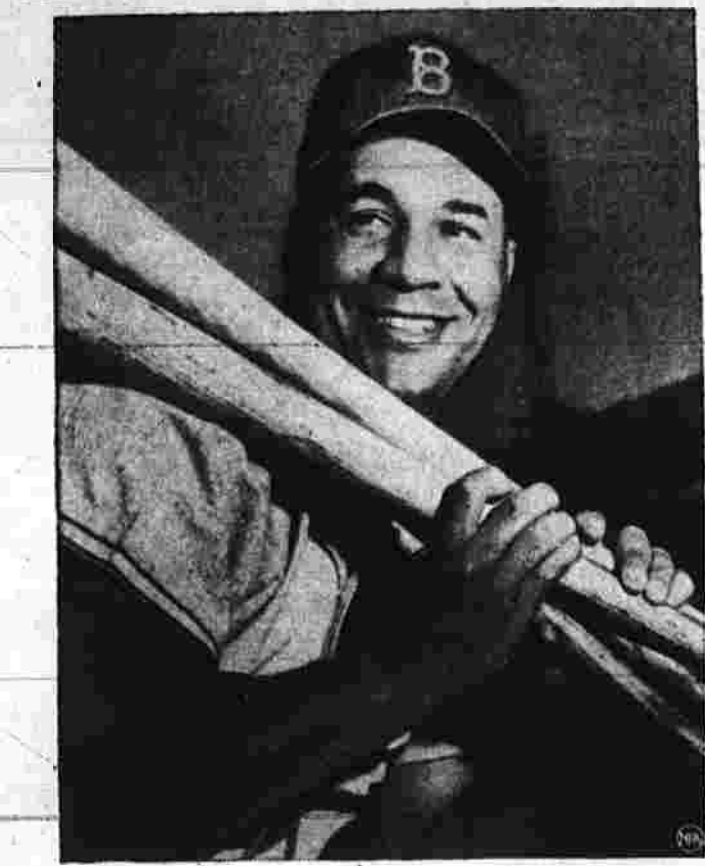

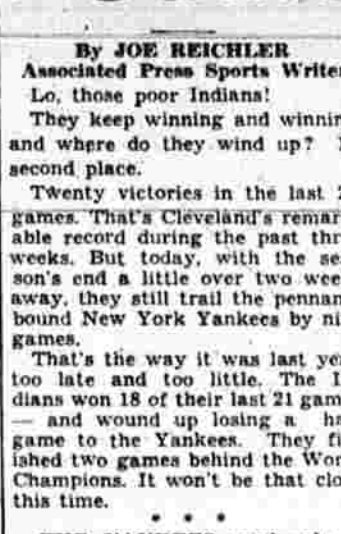
