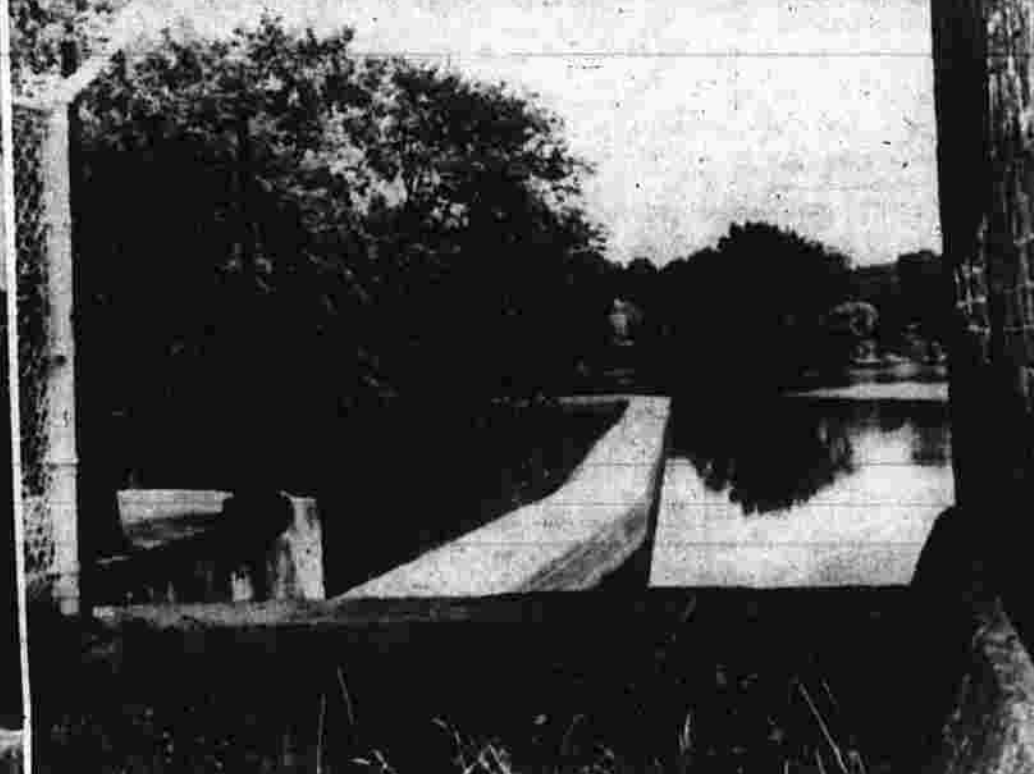

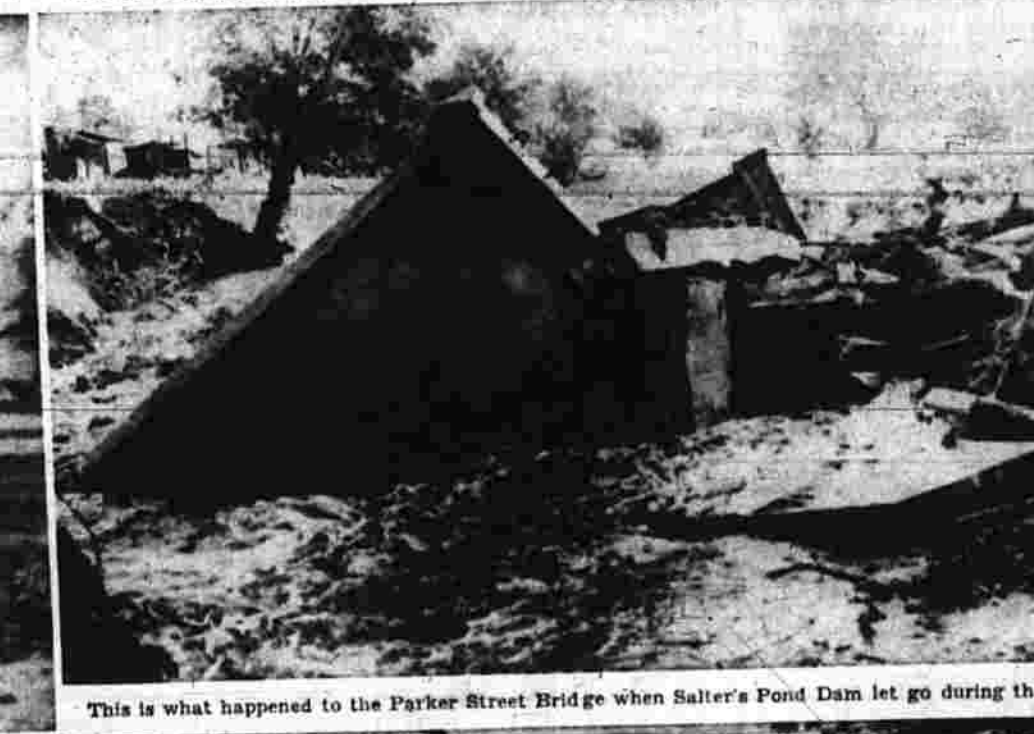

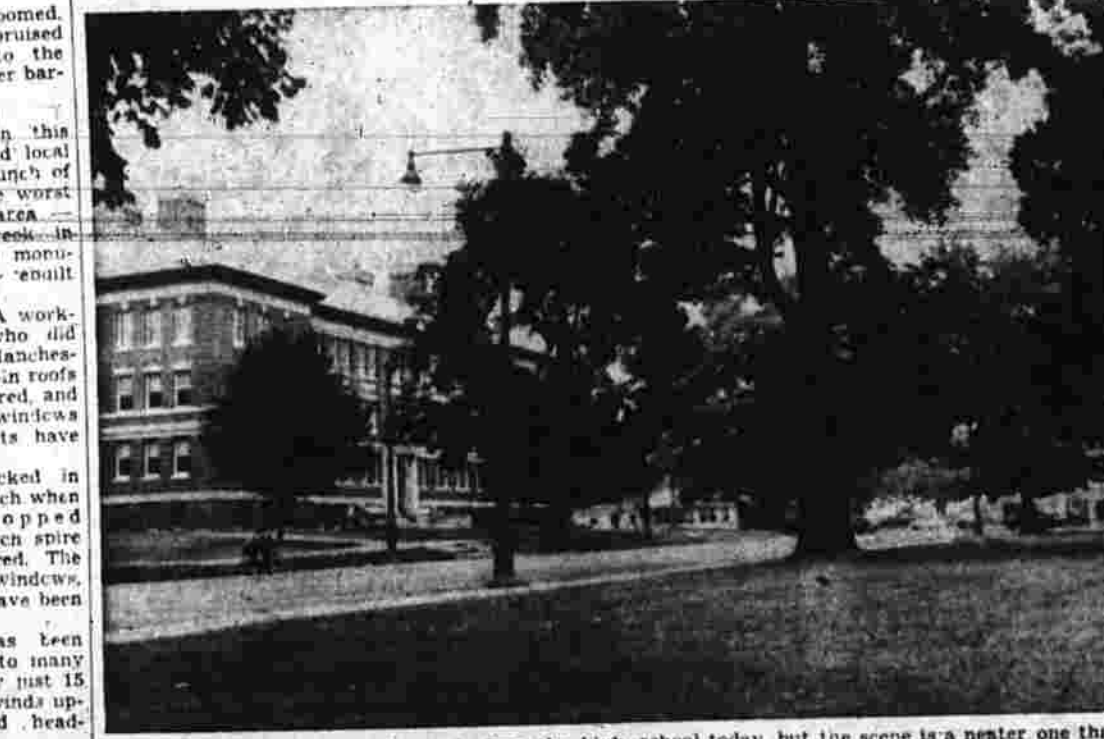


Main Street, near the high school, was a mess of uprooted trees clogging the road.

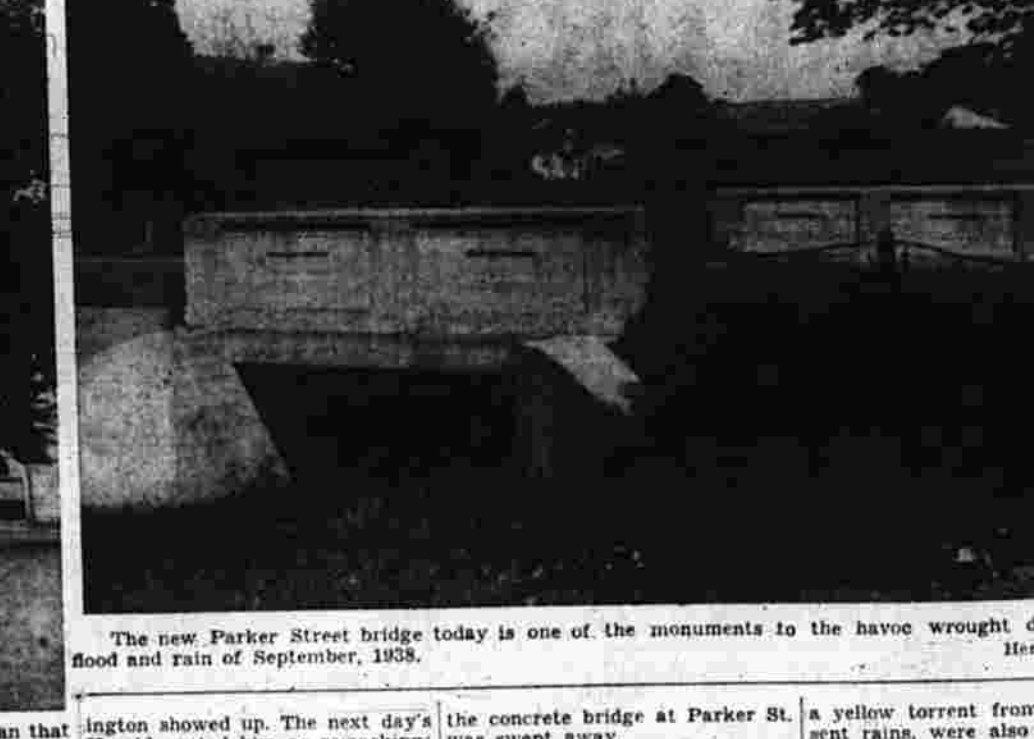


This is what happened to the Parker Street Bridge when Salter's Pond Dam let go during the flood.
