Civil Service Law Benefit to Vets

President Eisenhower has signed a law which steps up civil service appointments for any veteran who lost his chance for a civil service job because he served in the armed forces after June 30, 1950, according to H. Otis Clifton, director of the Veterans Administration. Clifton said that any veteran who wishes to get the benefits provided by the law, Public Law 121, must apply to the civil service office which has the record of that veteran's eligibility.

The veteran must apply within 90 days after discharge from active service, or by July 16, 1953, whichever is later.

Hospitalized veterans may apply at termination of hospitalization continuing for not more than a year after termination of active duty, or by July 16, 1953, whichever is later.

Veterans discharged before July 17, 1953 must apply on or before Oct. 14, 1953.

The benefits of this law are applicable to veterans who served in the armed forces after June 30, 1950 and who are discharged under honorable conditions provided their names appeared higher on the Civil Service register than eligibles who received preferential appointments from such registers after June 30, 1950 and during the period of the veterans' Civil Service ineligibility.

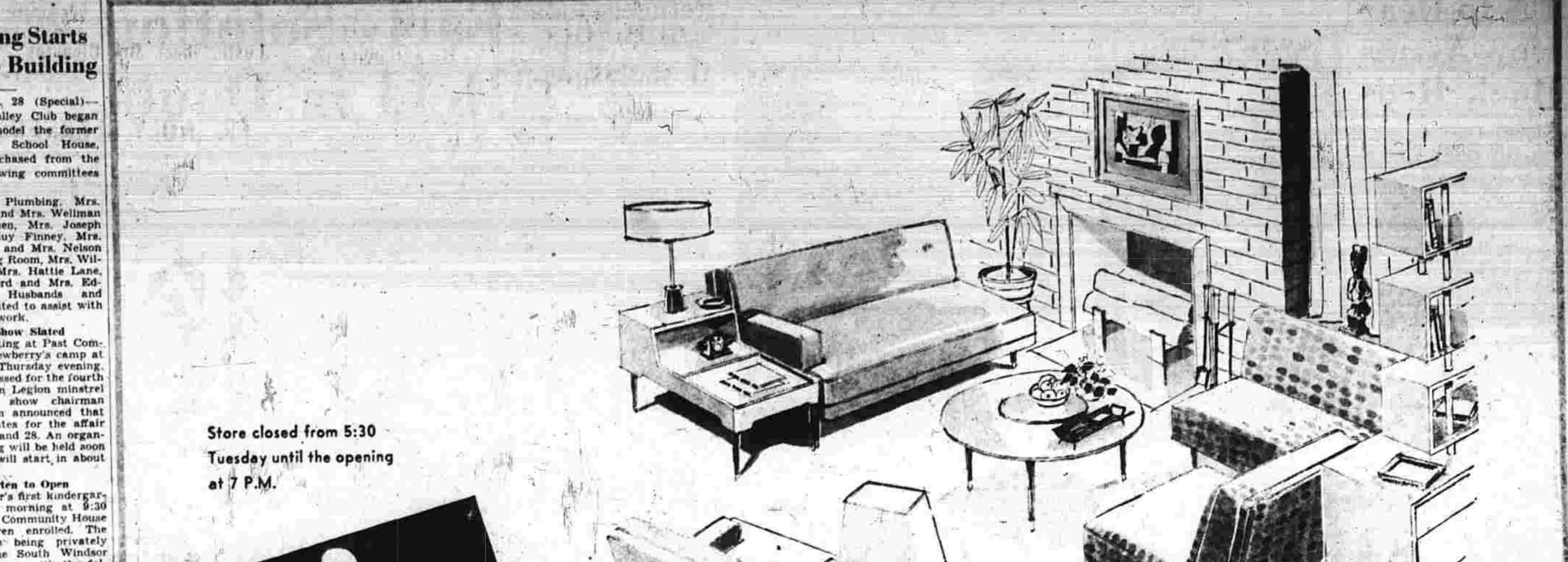

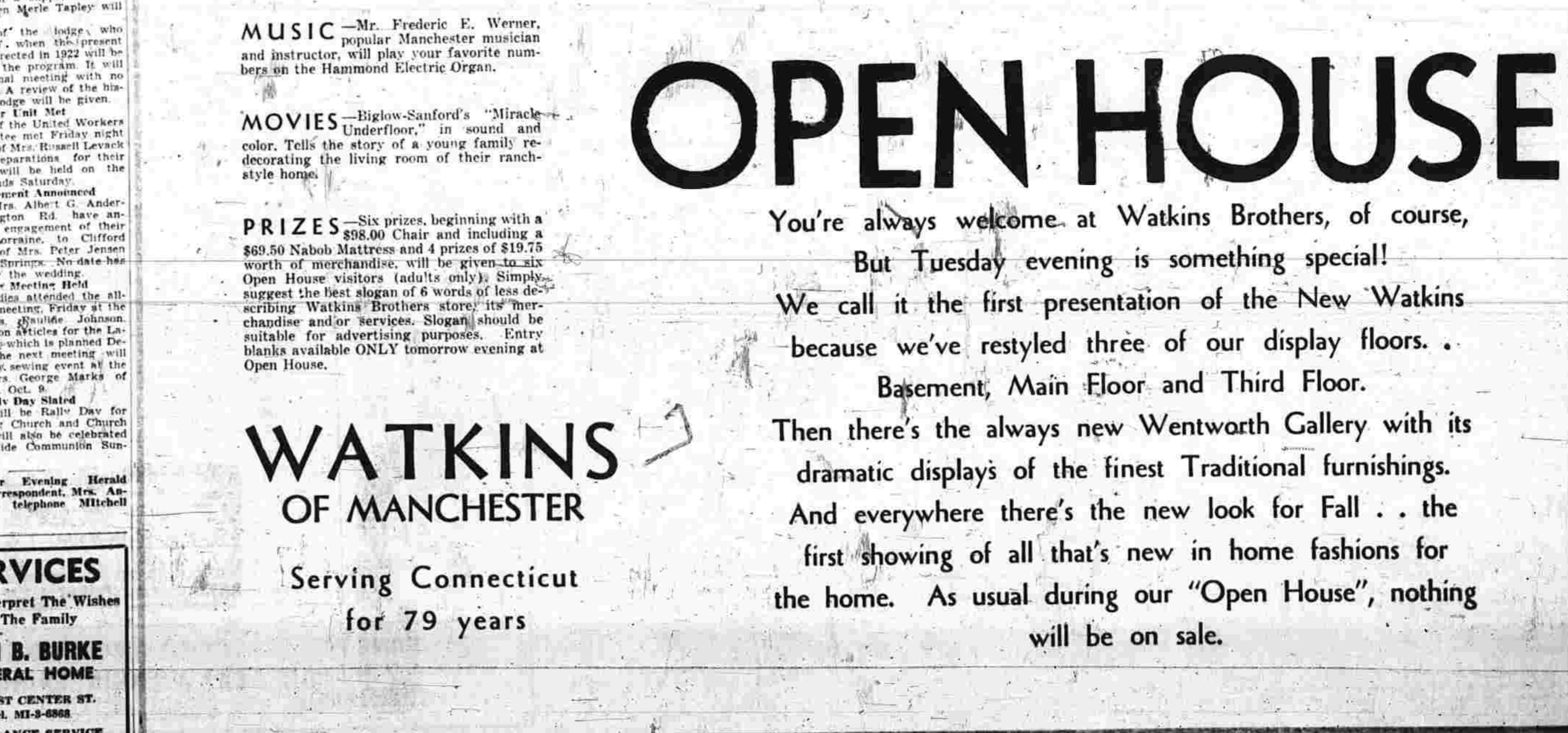

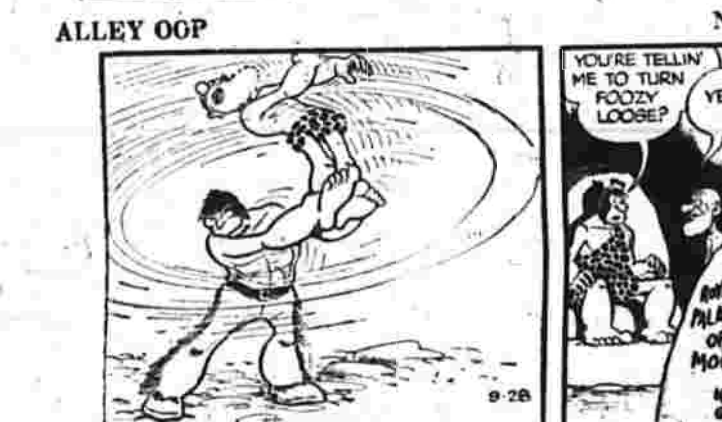
