He added: "Only the whole free community, we and our Allies together, our resources and the combined strength and big enough to protect our freedom and give us victory for freedom's cause."

Truman did not name any of the people he criticized. Basically, he said they are the "die-hard isolationists of 12 years ago," the people who say "the American thing is to cut taxes, whether the danger is over or not."
