Unit At Golden Jubilee With colorful and picturesque ceremonies, the golden jubilee of the Ellsworth Homestead in Windsor, owned by the Connecticut D.A.R., was celebrated yesterday afternoon, with several members of the local chapter, Grand Parish Chapter, attending. Mrs. C. Howard Tilton and Mrs. Richard Niese were the hostesses representing the local chapter. Mrs. G. Harold Welch, state regent, presided at the ceremonies, which included two tableaux and a recitation on the life of Oliver Ellsworth given in prose by Mrs. Charles Harvey, honorary regent of the Windsor Chapter. All participating were in colonial costume. Mrs. Niese wearing a gown that is over 100 years old. Ten were served to over 300 guests from two lovely tea tables. In the first tableau Mrs. Ellsworth, portrayed by Mrs. Richard Lord, was serving tea to her guests, Mrs. W. H. Kingsbury, Mrs. A. J. Anderson and Miss Sherman Hicks. Her daughter, Miss Marie Danton, was portrayed by Miss Patricia Trewhella. The second tableau showed Mrs. Ellsworth at home. In this scene, Mrs. E. J. Consett, Jr. took the part of Mrs. Ellsworth and Miss Suzanne Lord the part of her daughter Abigail. Present also at the ceremonies yesterday were a newsmen from Hartford, who covered the dedication ceremony 50 years ago, and the Rev. Roscoe Nelson, pastor of the First Church in Windsor, who will be 62 next month, and who was present at the ceremonies 50 years ago. Robert Lane, of Waterbury, has a soloist, sang three numbers. The Ellsworth Homestead is an old Colonial homestead which was built in 1746 by the father of Chief Justice Oliver Ellsworth and it was the home of the chief justice for many years. In it is found a bed in which George Washington slept on the night of his visits to Connecticut. In order to preserve this historical home, it was acquired by the Connecticut D. A. R. just 50 years ago.

Watkins Praised On Redecorations Throngs that visited Watkins Brook Open House last evening were high in their compliments of the changes the store has made in its arrangements and displays. Radio-TV Pastor Gives Sermon at Zion Lutheran

The 60th anniversary of the dedication of Zion Lutheran Church was celebrated Sunday with four exceptionally well attended services at 9, 10 and 11 o'clock in the morning and 4 o'clock in the afternoon.

The Rev. Louis J. Roehm, pastor emeritus, of Albany, N. Y., a devotional booklet writer who is also the author of a classic tract on the proper and Scriptural attitude of a citizen and Christian toward war and country, preached at two services in the morning, while the local pastor, the Rev. Paul G. Prokopy, delivered a sermonette for the pupils, parents, and teachers in the first morning service arranged especially for them.

In the afternoon, when many guests from neighboring cities were present, the well-known radio and television pastor, originator of "Moments of Comfort" and speaker of "Moments of Com-

fort," the Rev. O. H. Bertram, of Naugatuck, delivered the sermon. A number of followers of this radio and television comfort period, came to greet him personally. Although he especially brought home the Christian's privilege and duty as a Christian soldier in the church's army, he also, upon request, related something of the unusual responses and experiences, including, for example, saving a man who was prevented by "Moments of Comfort" from committing suicide.

Over various radio stations during eight years "Moments of Comfort" has been broadcast, about 400 times. A total of over 4,000 communications were received during the first 21 weeks of televising. The Rev. Bertram announced that a permanent place may be given "Moments of Comfort" at 6 o'clock on Wednesday evenings, instead of noon as is the case today.

In his sermon, he stressed how from the very beginning of Zion's existence, the Bible and the old Gospel, had been the foundation and power, as it should be—He mentioned that in visiting churches in summer he found that some people get merely a shallow social

Gospel, and that the old Bible base is often missing. After the service, supper was served at two sittings for guests and members while transmission music was presented at intervals.
