



This organization has often been asked for more detailed information than is contained in the annual appeal concerning its set-up and function in the town. Therefore, in asking the people of Manchester to contribute to this cause, we submit the following question and answer review:

- Q. What is the purpose of the Manchester Public Health Association?
- A. To provide nursing services when hospitalization is not indicated, and also health su-pervision in the homes of Manchester citizens.
- Q. How is the organization run? A. The Board is composed of a group of women who work on a volunteer basis. They are assisted by a volunteer business advisory board of 6 members; in addition there is a medical advisory board composed of 3 local doc-
- Q. How many workers are employed? A. Five full time registered nurses and one secre-
- Q. Is there a charge for a nursing visit? A. Yes, \$1.25 for hypos and \$2.00 for bedside nursing care. If patients cannot afford to pay the full amount, any fee is accepted. If patients cannot pay any amount, a free visit is made.
- Q. Are the services available to everyone? Yes. As we have said each year in our appeal, our visiting nurse service is available to all residents of Manchester, regardless
- Q. How can a nurse be reached? A. By calling the Public Health Nursing Association at 71 Haynes St. Telephone MI-9-7426, between the hours of 8 A.M. and 4:30 P.M. Saturday, 8 A.M. to 12:00.
- Q. Can a nurse be called at any hour, day or night? A. The nurses work an 8 hour day, from 8 A.M. to 4 P.M., but in case of an emergency, a nurse will respond after regular hours. In an emergency after hours, call The Manchester Memorial Hospital, Telephone MI-9-5201.

Q. What kind of nursing care are the nurses asked to give most often?

A. Any kind of bedside care prescribed by the family doctor, such as a bed bath, enema, hypodermic, change of dressing for a surgical case and care of chronic invalids. Help and advice to young mothers on the care of their babies is another service of the

Supervision—The nurses go into homes where they check babies, advise concerning inoculations, give pre-natal supervision and check tubercular patients. The visits are made once a month. Patients are referred by the Board of Health, Manchester doctors, Hartford doctors, Hartford clinics and our own clinics.
