State to Seek Bids Soon On Widening of Turnpike

State Highway Dept. plans to widen and improve a portion of W. Middle Turnpike and Center St. as moving nearer to realization.

The department is almost ready to advertise for bids on the project, Commissioner G. Albert Hill said today.

Reconstruction of the two streets, which are actually part of the same state highway, is one aspect of the state's continuing program to improve U. S. Route 6, which was begun after World War II.

Hill told members of the Connecticut Society of Civil Engineers yesterday that construction work had been completed or was under way on sections of the relocated route in Danbury, Newtown, Southbury, Waterbury, Bolton, Cheshire, Hampton and Killingly and that improvements for several other sections, including the one in Manchester, are almost ready for advertising.

The highway department's plan call for the widening and reconstruction of Route 6 in Manchester from the Wilbur Cross Highway east to Olcott St. This would be the westernmost section of W. Middle Turnpike, and Center St. east to Olcott St.

Present plans would more than double the width of the turnpike from its present 36-foot width to a 74-foot wide highway. The road would be four feet wide on each side of the existing east and west-bound traffic.

The plans also call for controlling access to the road to prevent entry from any point between the intersection of the road and the Hockanum River bridge, and the strip of highway on Center St. The road would be widened to 44 feet, to make it conform to the width of the street from Olcott St. eastward. The widening of the road now varies from 34 to 40 feet.
