McCarthy Will Quiz Convicted Atom Spy

New York, Oct. 16 (AP)—Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) said today he will go to the Lewisburg, Pa., federal penitentiary tomorrow to question atom spy David Greenglass on his plea of guilty to espionage.

McCarthy, who has been conducting hearings in New York into a radar spy plot, said he did not know when Greenglass would leave for Lewisburg.

McCarthy expected "complete testimony" to arrive today from a German scientist who reportedly told authorities that the Russians were using atomic spies.

Three Local Rec Centers Launch Seasons Monday

The three Manchester Recreation Centers will start operations Monday night for the indoor winter season.

The East Side Recreation Center will be directed by William Murray, who will be in charge of the gymnastics operations. John Cervini will handle the game room, Mondays through Fridays. The gym will offer basketball leagues, volleyball and free play periods five nights per week. The game room, open from 8 to 9 p.m., will offer a variety of games such as checkers, ping-pong, pool, etc.

Russia Loves Trieste

There is only one nation in the world which is really delighted over the situation in Trieste, and that nation is Russia. Russia likes the situation because it gives Russia a good chance to adopt an air of moral superiority. Russia is a nation whose word is no good.

In this instance, Russia has two exhibits to offer the world. It is no wonder she is preparing for a United Nations debate on the issue so she can call special attention to them. One is the Italian peace treaty, negotiated and signed by all the combatants against Italy in World War II.

This campaign promise, which could never be kept, has now been broken by us, and that is the real exhibit of the American word. The Russian would like to present to the world the broken promise.

By these two examples, what is America's signature on a treaty worth? What is America's word worth? No more, obviously, than the word or signature of any other power. And this, obviously, is a case the Russian cannot win at the United Nations will love to develop, if they get the chance.

And, speaking in the absolute sense, there is no defense of the American actions. In a relative sense, there is a defense. And it is of course, that Russia broke the Italian peace treaty first, before we did. Russia broke it in an indirect manner, by refusing to permit the United Nations to operate an international administrator for Trieste, as provided in the Italian peace treaty.

More hopefully, for those who really believe in the American principle of free enterprise, there is a heading to the Supreme Court. A direct test of constitutionality of the McGuire Act is now before the Supreme Court. And rule on the issue is pending.

Abd it will be the hope of many in America that it will rule, in such an event, to strike down forever all the "fair trade" laws in the country. The "fair trade" laws are one which grants special exemption from anti-trust laws.

It penalizes efficiency in retailing. It forbids competition. It keeps prices artificially high, in spite of whatever the natural condition of the market might be. It deprives the public of savings it ought to be making.

The high and lofty purpose of the "fair trade" law is to prevent "cut-throat" competition among retailers. But its most important actual result seems to be to give the wholesalers a firm grip on the throat of the retailer.

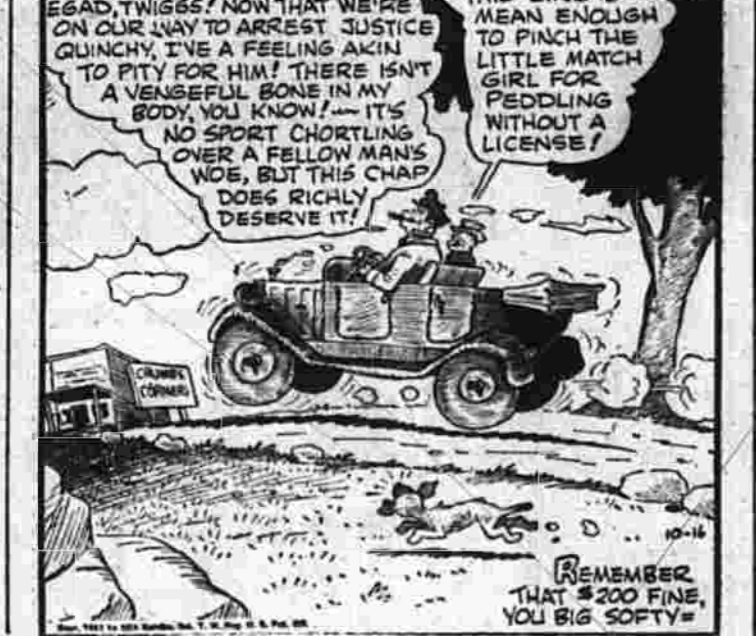

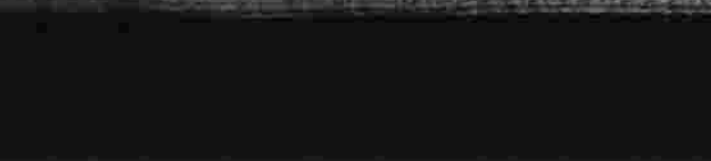
