## Chief Warns Of 'Goblins' On Highway

"Halloween is just around the corner, and the traffic goblins will get you if you don't watch out!"

"Sure, I believe in goblins," Chief Schenkel said today as he discussed the dangers that lurk in Manchester streets on Halloween. "But don't get me wrong. I'm not talking about the spooks that bring scared squeals from the youngsters. The goblins I fear are the traffic goblins who victimize untwenty kids at the wheel."

Chief Schenkel pointed out that youngsters are likely to let safety rules go by the board in the excitement of playing pranks and scavenging on Halloween. He said many of the child fatalities and injuries that occur on this holiday are caused by youngsters dashing out in dark costumes and wearing masks.

Parents cautioned "Masks prevent the children from seeing their own mistakes, and dark costumes prevent them from being seen by motorists. It would help a lot if parents would try to get the kids to take off the masks when they go outdoors. Parents should also see that the youngsters wear only light colored costumes or outfits trimmed with white or reflective material."

Chief Schenkel urged parents to enter the 14-inch basement window of the Reamson home. Still under investigation here are some 35 to 40 known sex deviates. Still being analyzed by the State Crime Laboratory at Madison are the stains, white bra and panties found two miles outside the city and the man's trousers found some 32 miles farther down the highway.

ing pinpointed all aspects of the case through its detailed questioning.

Still missing is \$500,000 of the \$600,000 ransom paid by Robert C. Greenleaf, the father. Hall has said he believes it was lost during a drinking spree in St. Louis.

During yesterday's session Heagerty was in the jury room for more than four hours. He told newsmen: "I've been telling them everything—everything I know about the whole thing. But I didn't say anything I haven't said before."

Heagerty picked up Hall as a fare and drove him around St. Louis during his free-riding binge. Later he tipped off L.A. Shoups, who had been arrested and most likely to Hall's room where nearly half the ransom money was recovered.

Shoups declined to discuss his appearance yesterday before the jury saying, "there's been too much talk already."

He turned in his resignation last Saturday after 27 years on the police force. He claimed he was a victim of character assassination during an investigation by top-level police officials. The police inquiry was called after reports that the FBI had found discrepancies in police records of Hall's arrest and recovery of the ransom money.

The St. Louis Police Board, however, has not yet accepted the resignation.

In another aspect of the case, charges were filed against a 21-year-old Edward Eugene Long of Kansas City. Police said Long, a hotel elevator operator, attempted to collect \$10,000.

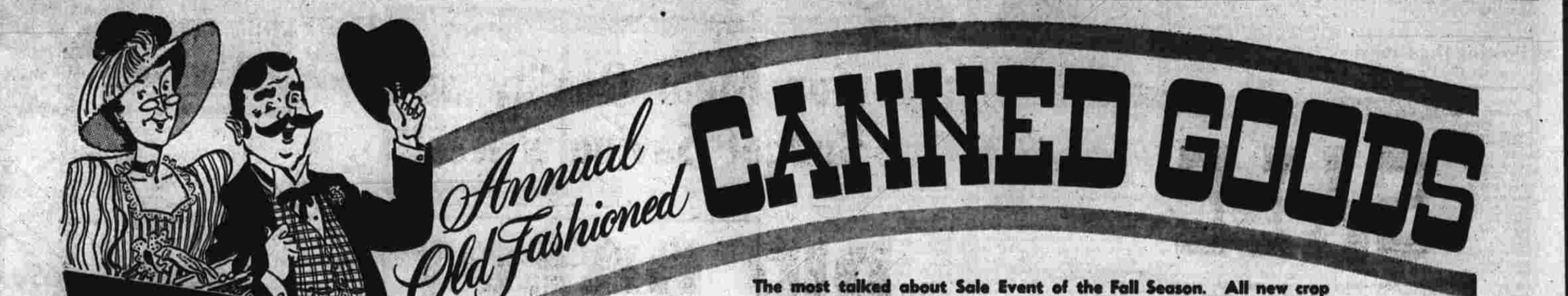

**\$15,000 Annex Is Backed**  
**By Church Building Group**

Bolton, Oct. 20 (Special)—Building plans for United Methodist Church advanced rapidly Tuesday night as the Building Committee met with architect John Rootford, Laurier Delmar, chairman, and the 10 members of its committee discussed projected and immediate plans for the church. A building at a tentative cost of \$15,000 was favored by the group and would be built completely separate from the present building, connected by a "breastway" as such structures are known in house planning. NINE Surprise Promised  
Manually, Lt. Gen. M. S. Thayer, Indian chairman of the defuncted National National Registration Commission, promised a "surprising" announcement Friday.  
He refused to amplify, but a reliable source said the announcement will concern "possibly anti-Communist Korean prisoners who have refused to stand interviews with Communist 'experts'."  
There was speculation that the Koreans might have agreed to attend, thus breaking a deadlock which has threatened to torpedo the registration commission.  
The deadlock resulted from Communist demands that the prisoners be forced to attend the explanation sessions. Russian and Ukrainian troops opposed the demands of Red Poland and Czechoslovakia. And Tamayaya ruled that India could not order the use of force without unanimous agreement among commission members.  
Dean, striving to progress in arranging for the peace conference, promised the Reds that if they would first agree on a time and place for the conference he would be prepared to meet them on exchanging views to the fullest extent possible. He also promised to bring the young set and his friends with him the best of luck.

"It still stands," said the source, that Dean does not have any authority on his own to change the U. N. stand on composition of the conference.

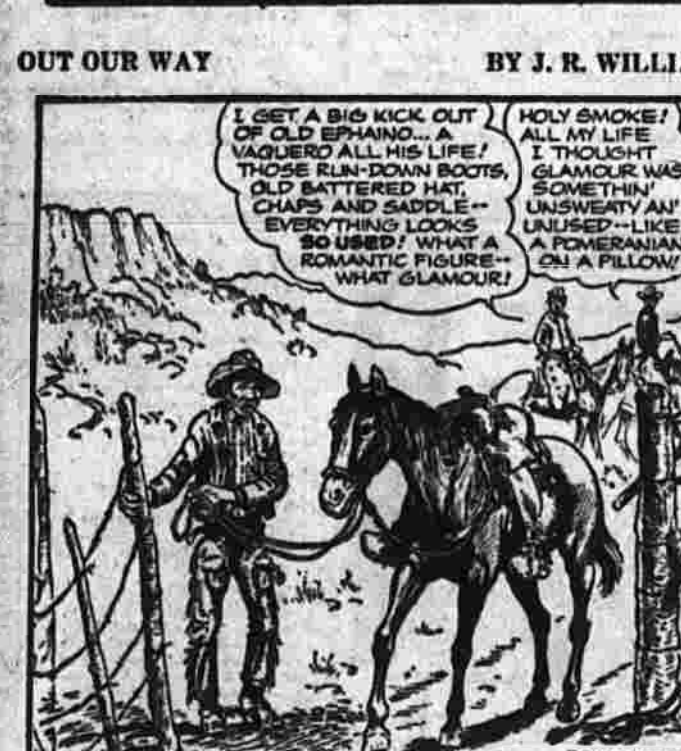
