must sit tight while the Navy Department's investigation is conducted and secret information.

The committee also announced that one witness already questioned had admitted that after leaving Navy employ he received Army contracts, one of them regarding use of restricted photographs.

Velde told newsmen he favors, and thinks other members of the committee favor, revision of the law to bar Communists from holding government contracts. He said he expected such a recommendation would be made later by the committee.

Velde said he planned no public hearings for the present. He said investigators "looking for espionage" are treating carefully the cause of the problem of national security.

Police Seize 'Zip Gun' Arsenal from Boys

Schenkel Bids Parents Help Uncover More

Homes-made guns, capable of firing 22 caliber bullets and known as zip guns, have been confiscated by police from West Side boys between the ages of 11 and 14, Chief Herman O. Schenkel reported today.



Police have turned up a "zip gun" which Schenkel said had been fired twice, and two "zip guns," one of them not yet fully assembled, in an investigation that involved 12 youngsters, most of them students at the Verplanck School.

The zip guns are constructed of wood and pipe and are held together with screws, tin cans and wire. They are also equipped with a bolt and have an action capable of sending a bullet with sufficient force to penetrate the wall of a .22 caliber shell.

Described as a novel invention, the zip gun, after models seen on television, is described in a paper-bound novel titled "Zip Gun Angels."

The zip gun arsenal was collected by police from youngsters between the ages of 11 and 14. The bullets, 22 caliber, were purchased to be fired in these guns, and two shots actually were fired by the boys as his text in making his gun.
