In talking with reporters, he said that in the 1948 campaign he had made a lot of speeches for Truman. This, of course, was after he had seen the FBI report on White and after White had been confirmed by the Senate.

Asked about this, Caudle said he felt he had done all he could by calling the report to the attention of Tom Clegg, who was Attorney General in 1946 and now is a Supreme Court justice.
"Besides," said Caudle, "there was no proof that these reports were true."
He remarked that a lot of people knew of the report and added that if, in fact, White was a member of an espionage system, "then they would have kept him out of the White House."

"I've thought perhaps that exactly why it was done," Caudle said. "He did not practice law in North Carolina, was fired from the Truman administration in November, 1951, in connection with a congressional investigation of tax scandals. There had been a disclosure that Caudle received a commission on an airplane sale involving tax advantages which were difficult. At that time, Caudle was in charge of prosecution of tax cases."
The Senators planned a public hearing beginning at 2:30 p. m. (EST), with Maj. Gen. Harry H. Vaughan as the witness. Brownell said FBI reports intended for Truman were delivered to Vaughan, then the President's chief of staff.
