Stratford Group's Suit Is Withdrawn

North Stratford, Nov. 16 (AP)—The Stratford group, a group of residents who blocked immediate construction of a helicopter plant, have voted to pull out of Superior Court a suit to stop the Sikorsky Aircraft Corp. from building a multi-million dollar plant.

An announcement by the association's withdrawal of the suit came yesterday after a conference between the company and the residents.

A lawyer for the residents said the company agreed to these points:

To provide a 150-foot buffer strip between the plant and nearest home and not to sell any of the property it acquires for this purpose for a period of three years.

To not fly helicopters over the surrounding homes except when it is necessary to reach the company's Bridgeport plant.

The association's action apparently clears the way for immediate construction.

The Stratford Board of Zoning Appeals has said it will not contest a Common Pleas Court suit filed by the Sikorsky Aircraft Corp. to force the board to issue permits for the plant, to industrial from residential.

The board's officials were not available to comment on whether they would accept the offer, but immediately start building the huge plant.

Diabetes Tests Free in Town

Plans for finding part of the state's estimated 13,000 unknown diabetics in Manchester were announced today by Dr. Harold J. Lehman, diabetes committee chairman.

At the same time, Dr. Lehman issued a plea for full public cooperation in this intensive drive to find and control diabetes which now ranks as eighth among the causes of death by disease in the United States.

The tests for diabetes will be given during this week until Friday, Nov. 20. In Manchester and over 7,000 other areas, county and municipal societies will make tests available to the public.

Every drug store in Manchester is serving as a collecting station for the urine specimens. Samples may also be brought to the Manchester Hospital or the family physician. Testing is also being made available to students who are treated at the hospital.

Diabetes, according to Dr. Lehman, is only chronic disease for which there is a known cure. Found early enough and treated properly, the disease seldom interferes with a patient's normal, full and active life.

Dr. Lehman explained that diabetes is a simple, quick and easy check.
