Police Nab Four Boys For Theft of \$12, Nails

Report 14 Punctures in Automobile Tires of Nathan Hale Teachers

Four boys, three of them juveniles, have been taken into custody by police in connection with the alleged theft of \$12 from a news paper delivery boy and the stealing of a quantity of nails from a construction shack on Spruce St., police said today.

At the same time police reported 14 tire punctures on cars owned by teachers at Nathan Hale School, although no complaints in this connection have been made against the boys.

The three juveniles — two are 11 and one 14 — were nabbed by police to have taken the money from the bag of the paper boy. Nathan Hale School pupils, on Nov. 8 and then divided it among themselves.

No date was given for the alleged theft of part of a bag of nails from the shack, which is owned by William Lewis, 176 Spruce St.

Involves Own Brother Police said one of the boys gave some of his share of the money to his 16-year-old brother, thereby involving him.

Police Chief Herman O. Schenck said the 16-year-old did not know the money was stolen, but he will be presented in Town Court Saturday on a charge of receiving stolen goods, as well as the charge growing out of the alleged theft of nails. Police said he participated in this along with the other three.

Schenck explained that police found out about the theft of nails during the investigation of the loss reported by the paper boy. He said he had been alerted to the fact that nails were being stolen from the shack by Miss Elizabeth A. Butler, principal of the Nathan Hale School, who Schenck said complained that the nails were being used to puncture the tires of teachers' cars.

According to Schenck, Miss Butler had learned that a number of the school's pupils were taking the nails from the shack, which is located near the school, and placing them point up under the tree. In all, 14 separate complaints of this nature had reached the chief.
