The eye and ear of the state, always in the doing of every last private citizen—that is what these authors of horror fiction imagine in the Communist state of the future.

Such a terrific state of affairs is always in our minds as something that might be imposed upon us by the Communists. It never seems to occur to us that we might have, by our own decisions, a kind of life which would be as gradually indistinguishable from the worst that Communism could dictate. And some of those who still have the capacity to see the danger look at it and tell us that each particular chipping away of freedom to preserve freedom is not too much from what we have. But it is still largely a matter of degree, with the approval of the Communist, that we, the land grow dark.

Don't be surprised if, years from now, historians say that we looked like the side of the great pieces of good news in 1953 was really bad news.

We refer to the uprisings in East Germany last June. The good news about these spontaneous uprisings was that they showed the spirit of liberty and defiance was not dead in East Germany, even after eight years of Communism. The good news was that they electrified the western world, and Western Germany in particular, into a new sense of unity with the people of East Germany. The good news was that these uprisings were a starting point for a new era of freedom in Germany.

From all these angles, the June uprisings, which only the full force of the Russian army could suppress, were an historic event. No free person, anywhere, could refrain from cheering them, from hoping that they would be repeated.

The answer is that many people seem to know this, and that, when there is no other way they could know it, they know it by the process of osmosis, in which, without any direct and selling contact with the dignity of the human mind, ideas are nevertheless being thought and shared.

And all kinds of opinion columns in along this line, as if this one more additional step toward the totalitarian life were nothing at all in the business of defending against the totalitarian life.

One newspaper which has kept the mind on the principle involved in the Wall Street Journal, in post-war expansionist system, took everything back under strict power control for a long time to come.

in retrospect, the June uprisings do look like the turning point in the history of the world. It is the point at which Russia began to turn back toward Stalin.

Now, going back to that point of view which considers the June uprisings as the turning point of the world, one must at least wonder if they would not have made much better sense if they had been delayed for a time, if the East Germans had gone along more with the relaxation of the Russian grip until, for one day, they were not interpreted as evil. Who would feel wholly secure knowing that any conversation could be recorded to use against him?

That may seem an expression of undue alarm, continues the Journal. "But the trouble with this notion that you can safely whittle away at Constitutional safeguards is that you don't know where the process is going to stop. If espionage wire-tap evidence is made admissible, why not father kinds of wire-tap evidence?"

"And if it is inconceivable that a given administration or a given head of the F.B.I. will ever be allowed this authority to be allowed, isn't that putting 'your faith in man, who die or may be replaced with worse men, and not in laws'?"
