Secondary School Problem Near Critical Stage in Tolland and Windham Counties

Towns Stall On School For Region

The near critical status of the secondary school problem in Tolland and Windham Counties was further revealed last week at a meeting of the Temporary Regional High School District Study group at the Windham High School.

Within the next three or four years, some 13 or 14 towns in the two counties will find it impossible to satisfy their projected high school enrollment needs.

Will Drop Outlets Students

At present, the majority of these towns send their youngsters to either Windham or Manchester High School as tuition-paying students. Were either or both of these schools able to promise to continue taking students from outside towns, the situation would not be so serious.

But, both schools have indicated they will soon be unable to satisfy the demands of outsiders.

Manchester High School, even today, is operating under the undesirable double-session system and will not have its new high school completed for at least three years. They have already estimated that tuition students will have to be dropped shortly.

Windham High School is still operating under the single-session system, but expects to be forced to adopt the double-session program by 1957 if they continue taking outside students. Neither the town, the Board of Education, nor the Superintendent of Schools in Windham is prepared to accept such a solution to the problem at this time.

How to Act

Most of the townspeople in the affected area, have been vaguely aware of the impending difficulties for some time, but they have been quite slow to act. Three or four

would accept double sessions for more than six months.

Neither Dr. Champlin nor Sypher looked forward to such a situation, since it would necessitate the reorganization of the district each time a member-town left. But they insisted they would not let the towns to any extent.

Also considered at the Windham meeting was an examination, by Dr. Champlin, of one of the tentative plans for the projected school district.

Three Junior High Schools

One possibility would see three junior high schools (grades seven, eight and nine) serving the needs of 2,000 students and an additional high school (grades 10, 11 and 12) serving some 1,800 students, all based on 1960 enrollment estimates.

The location of the schools under this plan, or any other plan, would only be decided upon the completion of the entire study.

might agree upon the establishment of a regional high school district committee for the district.

Towns That Have Expressed Interest

Towns that have expressed interest in this arrangement are Columbia, Andover, Scotland, Hebron, Hampton, Coventry, Chaplin, Mansfield, Ashford, Willington, Franklin, Bolton, Marlborough and Windham.

At this moment there is one big roadblock standing in the way of this district committee coming into being. It is the necessity of gaining individual town approval for membership. The delegates attending the meeting now are not official representatives of their towns and can not even begin a study of the existing problems.

There are several factors which prevent the towns from joining the Windham district study group.

Acts as Once on Child's Cough Spasms

First, some of the delegates, like the one from Willington, are not sure their towns will authorize the expenditure of additional funds for another study after they have already seen one accomplish so little.

Leroy Sypher, chairman of the Windham Planning Commission, admitted that it was possible that a town could pay at the rate of \$200 per pupil, but it was highly unlikely that any such figure would be reached in a study financed by 11 or 12 towns.

Sypher said the actual cost would be an insignificant fraction of all existing fee information from the State Department of Education and the University of Connecticut.

Two on the Fence

Already mentioned was the fact that Hebron and Andover are more on the fence and seem content to hold up their decision until they are able to see which of the two projected high schools will best satisfy their needs.

A third factor in the hesitancy of the towns to set up their district committees is the fact many of them see the problem as one way of life in the distant future. They generally think along the lines of "why act now we have

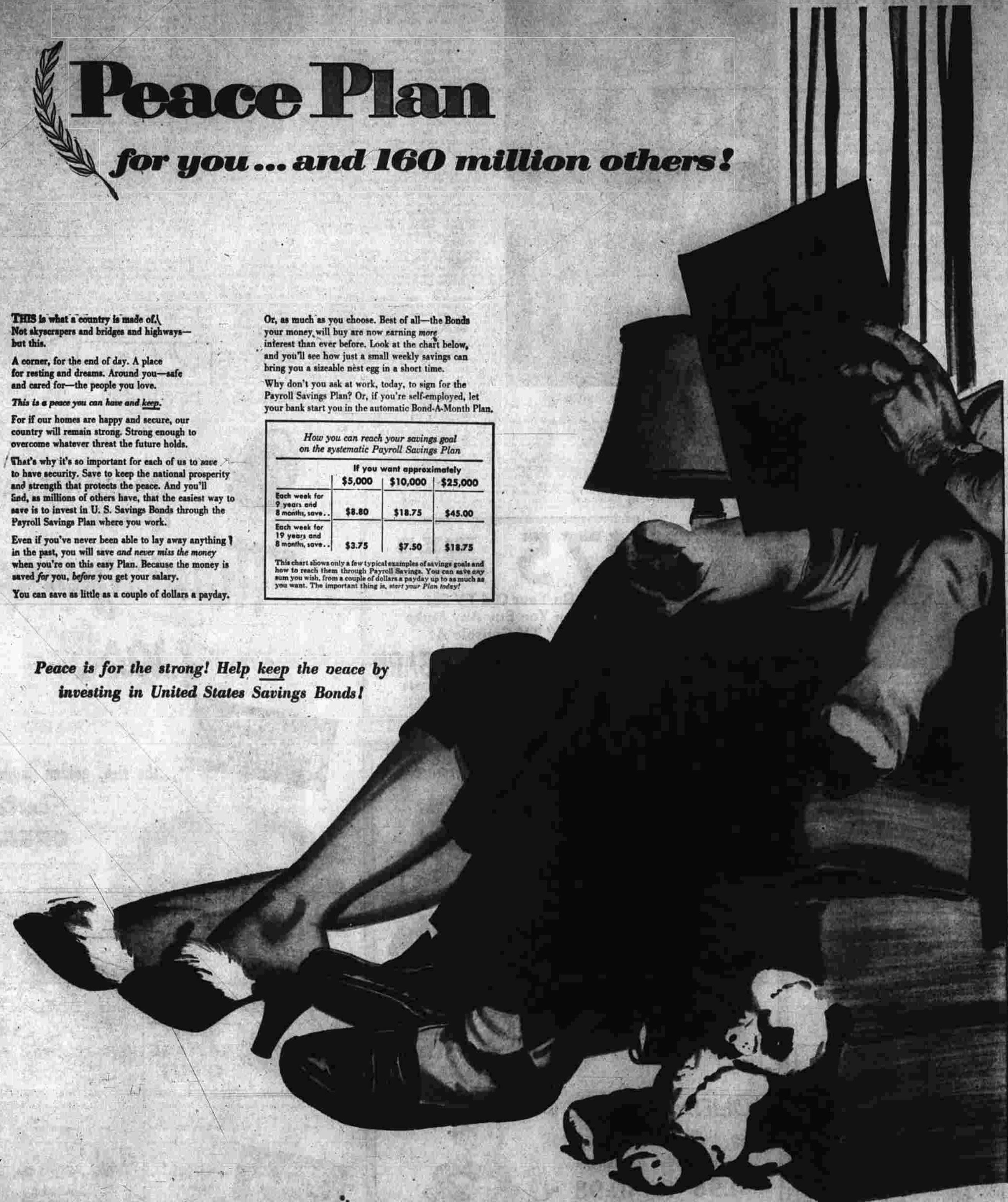

Hands Are Growing Old... Craft Dying, Say Weavers

Paterson, N. J. — The thunder was gigantic and unbearable. It seemed to hit you in your chest and your breath came in the short, heavy tempo of the banging, rolling, crashing noise.

Besides, it was very hot and very damp. You could see the fine spray of moisture seeping into the air by your humidifier hanging down from the ceiling.

A graying man who held a great, white handkerchief to his huge hands stood out in the middle of the noise and heat and humidity.

"I hate to think about this," he shouted through the thunder. "Most of us are getting too old to keep going. I worry about the alliance we'll leave behind."

This was "The Weavers" — a Paterson mail-order textile mill getting ready for the Christmas rush. Their product, as old as the holiday itself, is an intricately woven, hand-stitched baby shirt.

Each year thousands of these fancy infant's showings go into gift boxes as the mill to be sent out for use as receiving blankets, christening robes, carriage covers and crib blankets.

Running like endless threads through the noise was rattle of wool fibers. First a pastel-colored shawl revelling quickly on winding frames only to be reworked on fat, soft cones. And then onto tremendous warps, around penelope quilts and finally onto looms where wool runs through warp and thin strands and hard steel turn out baby-soft, shawls.

And everywhere there were hands at work on the wood, swarthy hands, white hands, thin, calloused, short-fingered, tapered hands. Tying ends, measuring, loosing, feeling textures, knitting fringes.

"But our hands are old," one of the weavers said. "Most of us are in our sixties now. We've been working at this kind of weaving all our lives. And they don't seem to be anyone to take our place."

He explained that young people who become weavers don't want to spend the necessary years to learn the skill of intricate work. They would rather work on plain fabrics at machines that ask no experience.

The fancy weaving skills were developed in Europe. And even at the Paterson mill the payroll

By RICHARD KLEINER New York (NRA) — If you think your new suit is the same as your old suit, you should look more closely. From year to year, men's styles change—slowly that most men never notice.

That's the general idea. Men don't like radical changes in their clothes. If, all of a sudden, tailors come out with suits with pointed sleeves, men will avoid them. But, if the tailors introduced pointed sleeves gradually, men will never know what hit them and they'll be wearing by pointed sleeves in four or five years.

Right now, there's a revolution in progress in men's fashions. Not pointed sleeves, but something else that's being changed ever so slightly each year. That's the notch in the jacket lapel.

"We've been raising the notch a little each year," says Spencer Witty, head of a top New York tailoring firm. "Just a little. You never notice it. We're trying to get it over on the men. We think the higher notch looks neater, but we can't do it all at once."

Snack Changes That kind of carrying-on has been the rule for generations. Tailors keep changing around with a simple suit of clothes—putting it out, putting flaps on the pockets, taking them off, lengthening the jacket, shortening it—but it always does so sneakily that you'd never know it's in the same as last year's.

Just for kicks, look back at what's happened to men's suits since 1900. Over 53 years, the changes become fairly obvious. Compare this year's dapper Dacron with grandpa's sorry Sunday serge.

Start at the shoulders. Grandpa would have thought padding in the shoulders positively indecent. In his suit, he had the mainstays of a limp banana. It wasn't until after World War I that men started developing colonial shoulders.

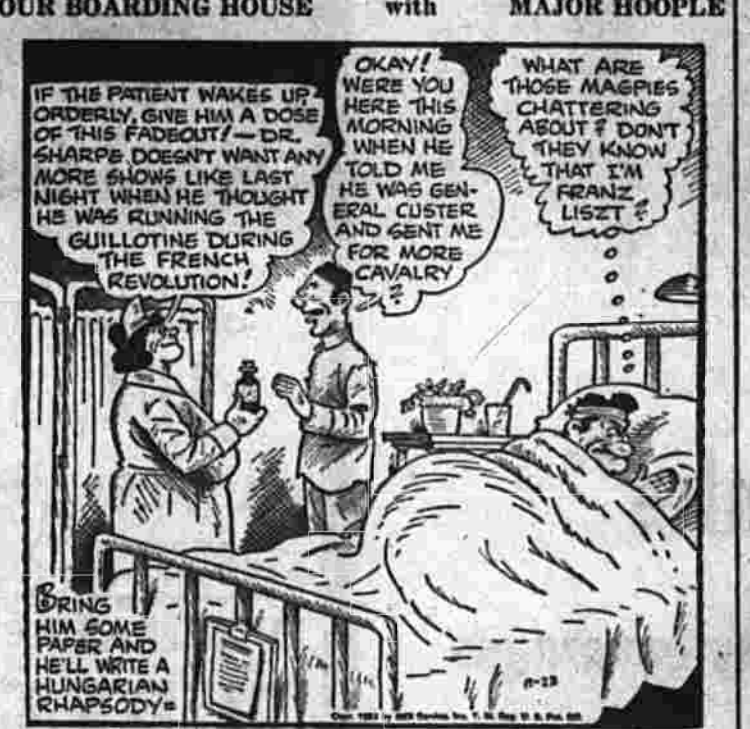

New York, Nov. 24 (AP)—David Greenglass, confessed atom spy, testified in writing today a radar spy ring headed by executed Julius Rosenberg "could very possibly be continuing to this very day."

A sworn deposition made by Greenglass at the Federal Penitentiary at Lewisburg, Pa., was read into the record at an open hearing conducted by Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy (R-Wa.), chairman of the Senate Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations.

McCarthy called the hearing ostensibly to support his charges that an espionage ring operated by the Army Signal Corps Radar Laboratory at Ft. Monmouth, N. J., "King Never Stopped."

Greenglass said that so far as he knew, the Rosenberg radar spy ring activities "never stopped."

He is a brother of the late Julius, who was executed with his brother, Ethel, in the Sing Sing Prison electric chair for passing atomic bomb secrets to Russia.

Greenglass is serving a 30-year term for his part in the atom spy plot. He had testified against his sister and brother-in-law.
