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Rockville-Vernon County's March of Dimes Drive Plans Are Revealed

Rockville, Nov. 25 (Special)—Preliminary plans for the 1954 March of Dimes drive in Tolland County were announced today by Atty. Robert F. Kahana, campaign director, with the drive quota set at \$20,000, a substantial increase over last year.
