President Arrives Safely For Bermuda Conference

Tucker's Town, Bermuda, Dec. 4 (AP)—President Eisenhower arrived safely in Bermuda today for the start of a historic, making Big Three conference with Prime Minister Churchill and French Premier Laniel. The presidential plane Columbine landed at American-leased King's Point, Bermuda, at 11:13 a. m. EST.

The British Prime Minister and French Premier Laniel, together with Churchill and Laniel, together with the United States were reported landing up support today for a plan to keep the U.N. Assembly on tap after it closes about next week. It then could be recalled quickly over Korea.

Observers predicted the project, called for an indefinite recess rather than outright adjournment, would meet opposition on two counts.

The scheme, springing from Laniel, feeling that Korea negotiation should be debated while special Ambassador Arthur Doan is negotiating with the Reds at Panmunjom, is expected to run into Soviet bloc opposition.

CD Wardens Get Lesson on Maps

Civil Defense District Wardens at a meeting last night at CD Headquarters, received a lesson in map making from Zone Warden Frank Budinac who stressed the need for using uniform symbols.

The lesson outlined a plan for making a "block map." The average block, Budinac pointed out, includes from 12 to 18 families. Budinac said an apartment block generally would require more than one block warden and more than one block map.

Each block will show by standardized symbols the location of fire hydrants, gas and water mains, high tension wires, etc.

The main purpose of the block map is to make available to the wardens all civil defense resources and their location in their blocks.

Larry Perry, plans and training officer for Manchester CD, showed the class two sound films entitled "Disaster on Main Street" and "For Atom!" He also answered many questions that arose during the open discussion held after the showing of the films.

Wardens attending class were Deputy Chief Warden John Moroni; some wardens: John Spencer, Stephen Peck, Frank Budinac, and David DeBartolotto; district wardens: Walter Horst, Raymond Green, Russell Elliott, Richard Trotter, Charles Cardella, Neil Conklin, and Carl McAllister, warden communication co-ordinator.
