**Report Hartford Postal Worker Driving Truck Hit James Leggett, 64**  
 Police today identified the driver in the hit and run case which resulted in critical injuries to a 64-year-old man Wednesday night as Joseph Boulanger, 153 Ashby St., Hartford, a postal employee in that city who was driving a mail truck at the time of the accident.  
 Boulanger was in Police Headquarters on Center St., shortly before press time today, and was to be arrested on a warrant charging him with evading responsibility and reckless driving. Patrolman Gordon Newdow investigated the accident.  
 Chief of Police Herman O. Schmidt said earlier today that Boulanger desired driving in the middle of Center Street, although he is reported to have told police he saw the man lying in the road after the accident and stopped his truck.

**Mahoney Approves Snow Plow Setup**

Director Walter T. Mahoney today revealed that he has conducted a personal investigation of the town's plans for use of snow plowing equipment, and is satisfied that the taxpayers are not paying for high priced plows on private trucks.

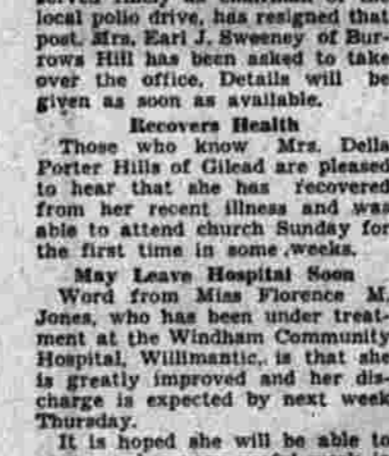

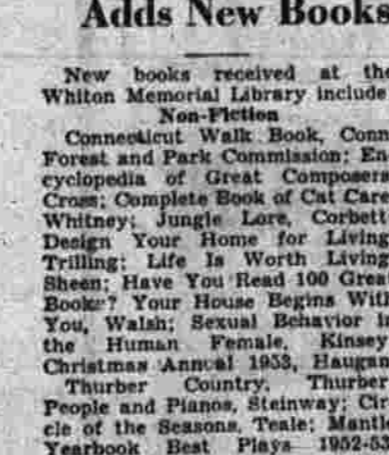

### The Doctor Says

#### PURPURA IS A DISTURBANCE IN BLOOD CLOTTING SYSTEM

It is supposed to be of the normal method and speed of clotting may be slowed or speeded.

Blood clotting may be modified to some extent. When there is a tendency to easy clotting within the body, a substance called heparin (which is a liver extract), can sometimes be used to delay clotting. A material called dicumol, obtained from spoiled sweet clover, has something of the same effect.

Some Special Clotting

It is on the other hand, it is desired to increase the speed of clotting because of a tendency to too easy bleeding. Blood transfusions, local pressure, and certain substances which can be applied locally, or injected, are sometimes helpful.

For most of us, fortunately, an almost perfect balance between too slow and too rapid clotting exists so that it is only rarely that we can improve on nature in this respect.

Purpura is commonly shown by black and blue spots under the skin or mucous membranes. These spots are hemorrhages through the blood vessels.

Actually, there are several kinds of purpura, the classification being based largely on cause and on which of the various substances that influence blood clotting are disturbed. The treatment, therefore, depends on the kind of purpura, and one cannot answer Mrs. S.'s questions on treatment without knowing which kind is involved and how severe it is, since there is a good deal of variation in severity as well as in kind.

We should all bleed to death after any tiny scratch except for the fact that the blood has a power to clot normally. There is nothing to stop the bleeding.

The opposite condition exists when blood clots form too easily or rapidly. The formation of clots inside the veins or arteries is called thrombosis and it is this that causes the flow of blood through the particular vessel which is involved.

Nature's method of regulating blood clotting is wonderful. At least five substances present in the blood influence blood clotting. They are prothrombin, thrombin, thromboplastin, ionized calcium and fibrinogen. When these substances fail to act on each other as they

As the parade of witnesses followed the chair cars down to the gas chamber, one convict shouted from his cell: "Four it on 'em."

Both were unemotional almost at once.

The death chamber door clanged shut on them, barring them from the world they fled. They were at 12:04 a. m. (CST). Thirty seconds later Warden Eldon tripped the cyanide lever, dropping the faces of the kidnapers in a white cloud, said the pair had been "as normal as they could be" since they entered the room Nov. 23.

"I don't think we've had any more normal prisoners than they were down here," Eldon said.

The Rev. George L. Evans, Episcopal rector from Kansas City, Kan., who was Hally's spiritual adviser, said both prisoners were "absolutely and completely reconciled" to death.

From the door of the gas chamber, Hally was on the left and Mrs. Heady at the right. That put her

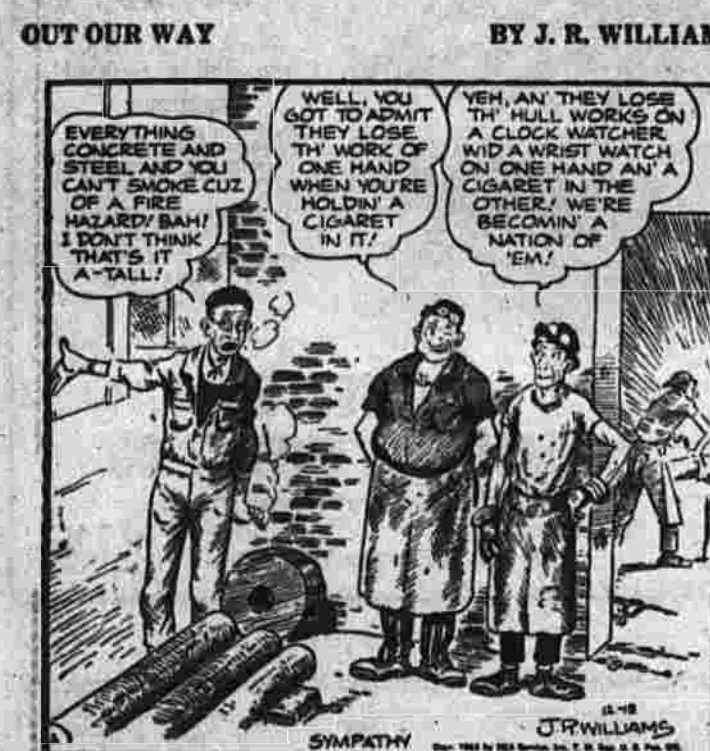
