Christmas Eve observances on the new front.

In line with the general prosperity and relaxation throughout the world, pilgrims poured into the little town of Bethlehem, the birthplace of Christ, fears that Arab-Israeli tension along the border frightens tourists away proved unfounded. The greatest influx of visitors since the 1948 Palestine War was in progress.

Officials said at least 42 chartered planes were arriving in Jerusalem this week in addition to 35 regular scheduled flights. Uncounted other pilgrims traveled the land route from Beirut, Lebanon, to Bethlehem, because of a shortage of accommodations, some stayed in Damascus, capital of Syria, and planned to drive eight hours to Bethlehem's Church of the Nativity—traditional site of the birth—for Christmas Eve Mass, then return to Damascus the same night.

Protestant gathered for the annual service this afternoon in the Shepherds' Field near Bethlehem, where the birth of Christ was announced to the shepherds by the Angel Gabriel.

With the foreign visitors to the village on the Jordan side of the border were 1,450 Christian Palestine Arabs from inside Israel. Following previous custom, Israel and Jordan also operated a direct Jerusalem-Bethlehem road to foreign diplomatic representatives attending the service. From Israel and the Jewish-held part of Jerusalem.

Capital Tree Headed

In Washington, the big community Christmas tree in the White House grounds was ready for its lighting early tonight by President and Mrs. Eisenhower. Just before 10:00 p. m. EST, via television and radio, the Chief Executive was to speak to the word of his hopes for peace and good will.

The President and his wife planned to unwrap their gifts tonight and fly to their Augusta, Ga., vacation cottage to eat Christmas dinner with their son, John, and his family.

As other Americans hurried through their last minute shopping and preparations for the holiday jolly, glow indicated children reported a booming business.

Carol singers already were spreading their traditional messages of cheer in cities, towns and villages throughout the land. At the United Nations headquarters in New York, singers from several countries serenaded workers and visitors with carols in English, Spanish and French.

The unusual note in Pittsburgh symbolized the tinsel. Steel mills will be closed tomorrow, with the city's steel every Christmas since the global conflict began.

Western Europe readied for its best Christmas since before World War II. More food and consumer goods in most countries promised a happier Yuletide than many youngsters could remember.

Thousands of American servicemen stationed in Britain, France, Germany and Austria pitched in to help make it even jollier. Soldiers, sailors and Marines collected gifts for orphans, distributed food to the poor and gave parties for children.

In France, however, a strike of mail carriers brought fears that many Christmas cards and gift packages would arrive late. French soldiers and a strike of airport employees hampered Paris-bound holiday travelers and holiday traveling Parisians.

To most Europeans, Christmas Day is traditionally a quiet family celebration and feast day with public festivities reserved for Christmas Eve. Special midnight masses were set tonight in all Catholic churches throughout the continent, on both sides of the Iron Curtain.
