Somoza not only directs the country's administration and runs the Liberal party, he's Nicaragua's biggest landowner by a considerable margin. He owns coffee plantations, banana, a shipping line, productive enterprises of all kinds.

Open to Debate
 How he built up his business and farming interests is a matter of debate. His enemies say he became a big businessman at public expense. Somoza says he got to be a rich man because he's a good judge of values and works hard.

There seems no doubt that 53 Presidents is an exceptional able business administrator. He keeps contact with the operation of his properties and it's conceded, by many that he is the hardest worker man in the country.

Somoza himself says he re-invests his profits in the country and there appears to be no doubt on that point.

His sharp eye for values some times enters into relatively modest things. On a recent visit to Panama, he made a quiet trip into the Canal Zone and did a good amount of shopping at U. S. Commissaries where goods are cheap because they are duty-free.
