British Still Require Aid, American Team Discovers

London—An American aid team on its way to Britain got a surprise. It is money down a rat-hole.
Does Britain show signs of standing on its own two feet, or must it continue to depend on American hand-outs?
How far American aid has spent? Has it increased Britain's industrial output?
Britain's industrial index stands at its highest since 1948, but three million workers in the engineering and shipbuilding trades are preparing to go on strike for a 15 per cent wage increase. The truth is that British industry is still a "sick baby". It must be spoon-fed with American dollars to become an efficient producer.
Both management and labor are dragging their heels.
Labor: "I wouldn't raise a finger so increase production," cries Edward L. Hill of the Bullmarkers' Union. "Unless I clean up the purpose behind it."
Millions of trade unionists would agree. Their memories of the black days of the '30's—unemployment, short time, the Means Test—are only too vivid.
Management: "How many American employers would scrap their old machinery and install the latest when their industry might be nationalized tomorrow?" asks C. C. Hargreaves of the Cotton and Rayon Merchants' Association. Hargreaves echoes the fear of hundreds of British employers, to whom the specter of nationalization is ever-present.
"Complacency, reluctance to depart from things of the past, and lack of initiative" are the afflictions of British industry, according to an American team sent over here to study the cotton textile industry.
Sensibly, nothing short of a revolution in British thinking will change the picture.
Because the cotton industry is typical, the findings of the American team sent to study the mills of Lancashire are worthy of study by other industries.
"The cotton machinery of the 400,000 looms in use, only 25,719 are fully automatic and one-quarter of these are over 50 years old."
Inefficiency: "It takes British mills twice as long to produce a given amount of yarn as their American counterparts."
One-shift operation: American mills work at least 100 shifts and three-shift working is common. Union ban on time and motion studies.
Mills Apathetic
Managements of many British mills are too apathetic; labor has not responded to the exhortation to increase production.
It is the American "doctor" it would apply to many other British industries as well.
Over \$200,000,000 of American "conditional aid" funds will be spent in the next three years in teaching British industry the "atomic facts of life."
The world's pioneer industrial nation is being sent back to school. An American expert to learn the ABCs of cost accounting, factory layout and organization and labor deployment.
Much of the money will be spent on "industrial subjects" subsidies to trade and employer associations "to keep members in touch with technical development."
But it will also be used to endow university chairs in engineering to finance "studies in monopoly, competition and restrictive practices."
American dollars, in other words, are doing for British industry what British industry should have done 30 years ago.
Now an industry prepares to slice up the latest American money, a startling suggestion comes from the Manchester Guardian. The British government should turn down the American loan. The Guardian writes: "Unless we have become a nation of mendicants we should shut our doors to the United States."
Towards the United States, the Guardian points out, "there will be nothing but appreciation of a rare act of generosity." Yet from the British point of view there is a cruel irony in accepting the aid.
Has the profit motive ceased to operate, or the British character grossly deteriorated, the Guardian asks.
