





plains. But with children it's dif-ferent. Finding a child's body always wrenches a fireman's heart. "You just never get used to it," says Woodworth. "You always feel sick . . . maybe mad. Eve seen a district chief mad enough to kill the person he thought was respon-sible for child deaths in fires." In a report on fire casualty statistics by the National Office of Vital Statistics, old people and pre-school children are listed as the school children are listed as the

principal victims of fires. . . "Among the causes of the high (fire death) rates of both the lower and upper portions of the age-span must be inability to fight ires or to get away from fires, ineptness at handling combustible materials, and delayed reaction to he stimulus of fire," the report

says. Children, Aged in Danger Children and the aged are espe-cially likely to be trapped in oil-fed fires in homes, Woodworth

says. Take a fire at Ambler, Pa., last October, for example. A 28-year-old mother and her five children died in flames after an oil stove exploded. The children ranged from six years down to three months. The four occupants who escaped were adults. Other "typical" reports in the files of the National Fire Protec-





Grand List Hiked \$592,000; Finance Lecture 27 Mill Tax Seen Possible

Bolton, Jan. 8 (Special)-A good break for local taxpayers was contained yesterday in the 1953 Grand List totals \$4,736,000. This is an increase of \$092,000 or about \$250,060 more than was anticipated when the town budget was set up in October.

In presenting the budget for approval, the Board of Finance estimated it would be necessary to raise \$118,234.70 through general property taxes to cover budget items. Estimates of the grand list total at that the total at that time were four and a quarter million which would have indicated a tax levy of 28 milis

for budget items. The \$4,700,000 figure released by E. Pierce Herrick of the Board of Assessors who compiled the abstract of the grand list, would indicate the tax levy for budget items should approximate 25 mills. A vote of the town two years ago rovides for an additional 2-mill evy for the reserve fund for capital and non-recurring expenditures, indicating a final tax rate of 27 mills. Last year's total levy was 24 mills.
