Soviet Motives Still Unknown

Washington, Jan. 13 (P)—President Eisenhower said today this country's preliminary atomic talks with Russia are encouraging, but it is too soon to tell whether the Soviets are acting in good faith. His reference to the atomic talks, which were an outgrowth of his proposal for an international atomic energy pool for peaceful purposes, came at a news conference in which the President also discussed important domestic issues.

On the controversial farm program which he submitted to Congress last Monday. Elsenhower declared he believes it is workable and practicable. As to whether it is politically feasible in this election year, the President said we'll find out about that later, but that he is convinced the program for a switch to flexible price supports is right.

On his labor law proposal for a system of government-conducted elections among employes on the question of striking, the President said he would leave to Congress whether such votes should come before or after a strike has begun.
