The government, Italy's third in six months, was toppled when the Chamber of Deputies re-fused to give Fanfani a vote f confidence. The vote gainst him was 303 to 260. Communists, fellow-traveling So-cialists, Monarchists, Neo-Fasciats, pro-Western Democratic Socialists and even one of his own Christian
