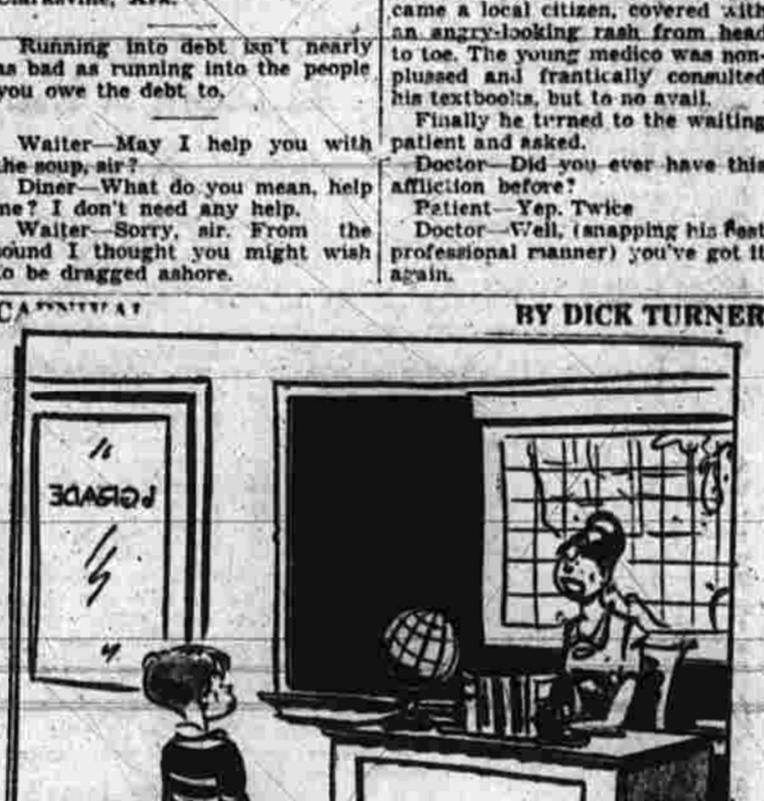

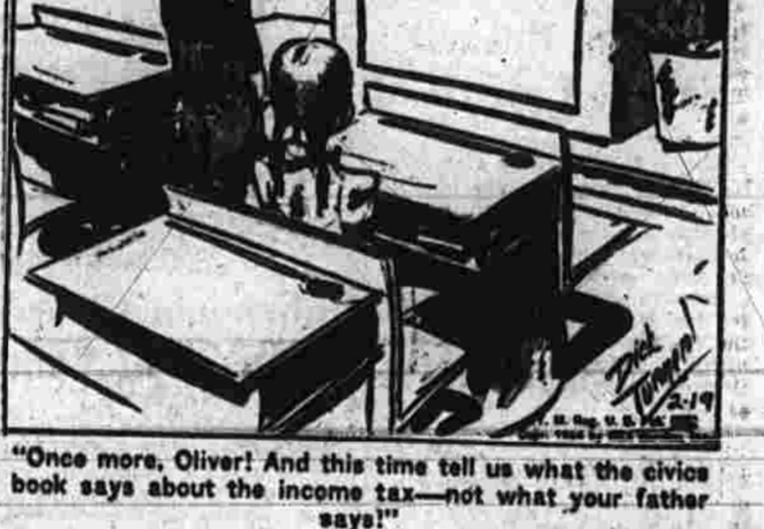

Berlin (NEA)—"Main Herr," said the little gray-haired lady in German, "can I sell you a book of Russian tales for children?"

She was standing with a young woman behind the Russian newsstand at the press center, next to the castle where the Big Four Foreign Ministers were meeting.

"Thank you, Madam, I'd love to buy a book of Russian children's stories," I replied in Russian.

"The little lady smiled. Her great brown eyes began to sparkle. Mrs. A. had a Russian name, she explained. 'You perhaps even know our Russian. It is a wonderful country. Beautiful!'

She was a typical peasant woman of probably not more than 40. Yet her hair was snow-white. Her skin was yellow as if she had been in the sun for years. It was a peculiar way, which seemed due to age but to undernutrition.

"There was something pathetic in her eagerness to sell me the Red Star Station Wagon while green and beige coated fabric is used on the Special Station Wagon.

"I am sure, Madam, Russia is a beautiful country," I said. "My country, America, is beautiful, too."

"Amerikana!" exclaimed the woman.

There was no hostility in her exclamation, but rather surprise. I thought she stared at me as though I were a creature from Mars. After years of Red propaganda against the "blood-thirsty Wall Street warmongers," the little Russian woman was probably surprised to find an Americanist so comfortable in Soviet Russia.

"I don't like America," said the young woman, who until now remained silent.

She was a girl of about 20 and seemed very nervous. She looked the typical dedicated Communist in young Communist. Her black hair, combed straight, was tied in the back with a faded red ribbon. She was wearing a blue jacket and a white threadbare jacket over a white-colored sweater generously speckled with green spots.

"Why don't you like America?" I asked.

"One never sees the sky in your country. It is hidden by the tall buildings," she said.

"The Americans are mostly in cities like New York and Chicago. I can assure you we see as much of the sky in America as you do in Russia. It is the same sky."

For a moment the Russian said nothing. Then she sprang the line I anticipated.

"America wars war."

"And Russia?"

"The Russian leaders fight for peace."

"And what about the American workers?"

"The American workers are too hungry and too watched to think for themselves," replied the Communist.

"They are misled by capitalist propaganda."

"I shall buy one of your books," I said. "I want one without propaganda."

"There is never any propaganda in our books, especially in stories for children," she said. "Soviet Russia does not glorify the military or war. We are for peace."

She handed me a lavishly-illustrated book of Russian stories for children. It was printed by the Soviet Ministry of Education.

A drawing of a Red Army officer surrounded by a group of children attracted my attention. It was an illustration of a poem entitled "Our Officer."

All straight officers came home on leave. They follow him everywhere. For every youthful pioneer hopes to grow up.

To be as brave as a Red Army officer.

"Now I am convinced that Soviet Russia does not glorify war," I told the Communist.

My irony was lost on her. In her own way she was sincere. She was probably convinced Russia was really fighting for peace at the Four Power Conference.

After years of Red propaganda she had been so thoroughly brainwashed that she could no longer distinguish black from white.

The older woman lowered her eyes and said nothing.

'Rocket' Engine Shines in Test

Greater performance and economy of the improved "Rocket" engine in the 1954 Oldsmobile was proved conclusively in tests conducted last summer at Monarch Pass, Colorado, and at the Indianapolis Raceway, according to Oldsmobile officials.

The larger 185-h. p. "Rocket" engine for 1954, with greater displacement of 224 cu. in. and higher compression ratio of 12.5 to 1, outperformed the 1953 "Rocket" engine even though using less fuel.

In both tests, two 1953 Super 88 four-door sedans were lined up, but one of them was equipped with a 1954 "Rocket" engine, while the other had a 1953 engine. A five-mile stretch of the eight-mile road to the summit of Monarch Pass was employed in the Indianapolis test. The grade ranged from 7 to 9 per cent. Elevation of Monarch Pass at the top is 11,212 feet.

The 1953 Oldsmobile required 34 minutes to cover the five miles up Monarch Pass. The Oldsmobile with the 1954 "Rocket" engine was timed in 34 minutes, 24 seconds, finishing almost a mile ahead. The 25-second time advantage marked a 17 per cent improvement over the 1953 "Rocket"-powered Oldsmobile.

The test at Indianapolis was a 10,000-mile economy run in which both Oldsmobiles maintained a constant speed of approximately 60 m. p. h. The cars were operated continuously, night and day, for almost a week, with stops made only for gasoline, oil, tire rotation, and driver relief. The drivers were at the wheel in four-hour shifts.

At the end of the run, the Oldsmobile equipped with the 1954 "Rocket" engine had used approximately 10 per cent less gasoline than the 1953 Oldsmobile.

"These tests help to prove that the new 1954 'Rocket' engine provides better performance and economy than its 1953 counterpart," Metzel said.

Some Parents' Questions Reflect Unnecessary Worry

Uncertainty as to whether a tragedy could have been prevented by different behavior certainly causes a great deal of mental suffering. As an example of this one mother wrote that she and her husband suffered the heartbreak of losing a baby girl two days after birth.

The cause of the child's death was said to be heart disease, and the mother wanted to know whether the father's drinking could have had anything to do with it.

"To this it can be said that while there are other undesirable effects from excessive drinking it is not thought a cause of heart disease."

Another correspondent writes that her three-year-old daughter, who has a good appetite and seems to be gaining so much weight that she wants to know if she should be put on a diet. She also asks whether soda pop and ice cream are fattening.

"To the last it can be said that both are fattening, and rarely constitute a good diet for a three-year-old child, except occasionally. As to whether the child should be put on a diet or not, that depends on two packs of cigarettes a day, and her apartment just reeks of this foul cigarette smoke. Her child, since the day she was born, has been inhaling all this smoke. The child (according to Mrs. A.) looks pale and eats like a bird. The mother, she says, spends 95 per cent of her time smoking and watching television."

Finally, Mrs. C asks my opinion about a six-month-old baby who cries himself to sleep every night, crying for a half hour at a time.

"It is not considered desirable to let a small baby cry too long since there is some increase in danger of rupture, and generally speaking, hazards, it can only be said that in the light of present knowledge, it is questionable that the child would be uncomfortable in some way. On the other hand, even small babies need attention and try to get away with things. If they find they can get picked up by crying, they may develop this habit."

Often these are hidden "plus" values that the owner discovers only after driving a new model.

The 1954 line of Studebaker cars incorporates numerous engineering improvements, all of which add to the satisfaction of driving an advanced style car.

One of the outstanding engineering improvements in 1954 Studebaker is the new brake system which provides the largest brake lining area per pound of weight of all the 42 leading production models built in the United States.

Commanders and Land Cruisers lead all other makes in the weight-lining area ratio, and only one make, a high-priced model, exceeds the Champion. This fact was revealed in technical data based on the comparison of cars, using 4-door, 6-passenger sedans for comparison.
