Levy Tells Of Trotter Stock Deal

New York, March 4 (AP)—George Morton Levy, counsel for Roosevelt Raceway, has told state harness track probate court that he bought Trotter stock for \$25,000 for the daughter of former GOP National Committee member J. Russell Sprague.

The witness said that Mrs. Adams' husband, Boris, became ill after war service and was under medical treatment and that "they" wanted to make sure of a future income.

Boris stepped down last November as New York State Republican National Committee member after he charged that city supervision of the hospital was found inadequate by the city itself.

Goldstein said the city probe found a hospital that refused to admit to the sanitary code and health department rules, yet had been permitted to operate since 1949 without a license.

Nine hospitals, he said, were supervised by the health department but not licensed by the state and two had been reported to be living on the edge of bankruptcy.

The Hospital Department lacks personnel, he said, and that "they" were unable to keep up with the needs of the city.

Public Hails Reprimand To Senator

Washington, March 4 (AP)—The White House reported today that President Eisenhower has received "hundreds" of telegrams praising his call for "fair play" in congressional investigations—a call widely accepted as a rebuke to Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.).

James C. Hagerly, presidential press secretary, told newsmen he had no exact count but the total was "in the hundreds" and they ran 9 to 1 in praise for the President.

They are very much in favor of the reprimand, Hagerly said.
