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Red Trade Nations To Receive U. S. Aid

Washington, March 5 (AP)—President Eisenhower today ordered continuance of U. S. aid to Denmark, France, Italy, Norway and the United Kingdom despite shipments of strategic materials by each of those countries to Iron Curtain nations.

In a report to Congress required under the Mutual Assistance Control Act of 1951, the President said he was doing so "because the cessation of aid would constitute a detriment to the security of the United States."

Stassen Report Given
With his report, Eisenhower sent to the lawmakers a letter to him from Harold E. Stassen, chief of the Foreign Operations Administration.

Stassen told the president that most of the shipments of strategic materials to Iron Curtain nations were made prior to the effective date of the embargo provisions of the 1951 law.

Stassen added that some of the other shipments are the result of more recent commitments which, in unusual circumstances, other countries have considered necessary or in the long run beneficial to themselves and to the world.

Because of the two-way trade that was made possible by the strategic shipments.

The 1951 law, known as the Battle Act, forbids all U. S. military, economic and financial assistance to any country which knowingly permits the shipment of arms, munitions or other military equipment, or in cases where the President finds that a cessation of aid would be detrimental to the security of the United States.

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Ex-Capone Era Gangster Dies, Believed Broke

Chicago, March 5 (AP)—Terry J. Druggan, the volatile, dapper hoodlum who with Scarface Al Capone was one of the pioneer millionaires of the prohibition era, died yesterday.

Druggan, the one-time Beau Brummits of Chicago's fabulous period of gang warfare in the early 20s had been ailing for years. He had been out of the public spotlight for some 20 years, after his release from prison.

Was Former Beer Baron
Druggan, who was about 65, died in a West Side hospital where he had been confined for a week. His name was in the headlines during the days when he teamed with Frankie Laine in peddling beer. Today his death notice appeared only in the paid obituary columns of a Chicago paper.

Prohibition made millionaires beer barons of Druggan and Laine as they fought and shot their way side by side almost to the top of the heap of gangsters and bootleggers. Mainly he served the C.A.

Hanoi Airport Hit by Rebel Raiders

Hanoi, Indochina, Thursday, March 4 (AP)—French Army troops today reported that Communist-led Vietnamese raiders had hit Hanoi's big civil airport, five miles away at Giam, and blew up an undischarged number of airplanes today.

The exact losses were not disclosed. But Army spokesmen said several planes had either been destroyed or partially wrecked or explosion.

In Saigon, the French High Command announced that "about 10" aircraft were damaged or partially destroyed in the raid. It said most of the planes were C-47s belonging to private companies and were used in transporting men and material to the front.

The Vietminh raiders apparently attacked Giam from the north, and the arrival of about 100 American troops at Giam before dawn today was reported.

The Vietminh raiders attacked at about 2:30 a.m., going from planes to planes on the main airport runway and then to the planes on the ground.

The airport's guard opened fire on the raiders as big explosions and a hail of bullets were heard clearly in Hanoi, across the Red River.

Washington, March 5 (AP)—The Civil Aeronautics Board decided today to suspend Arthur Godfrey's pilot certificate for six months, effective March 16 as a penalty for careless flying at Teterboro, N. J., Airport Jan. 7. The action came in the form of a recommended decision by CAB Safety Examiner Albert H. Kupper.

Godfrey, 47, has the right of appeal, but a recommended decision by a safety examiner customarily is adopted by the board as its own decision.

The recommended penalty was surprisingly severe in view of the fact that Godfrey's violation was a minor one, and that he had no previous record.

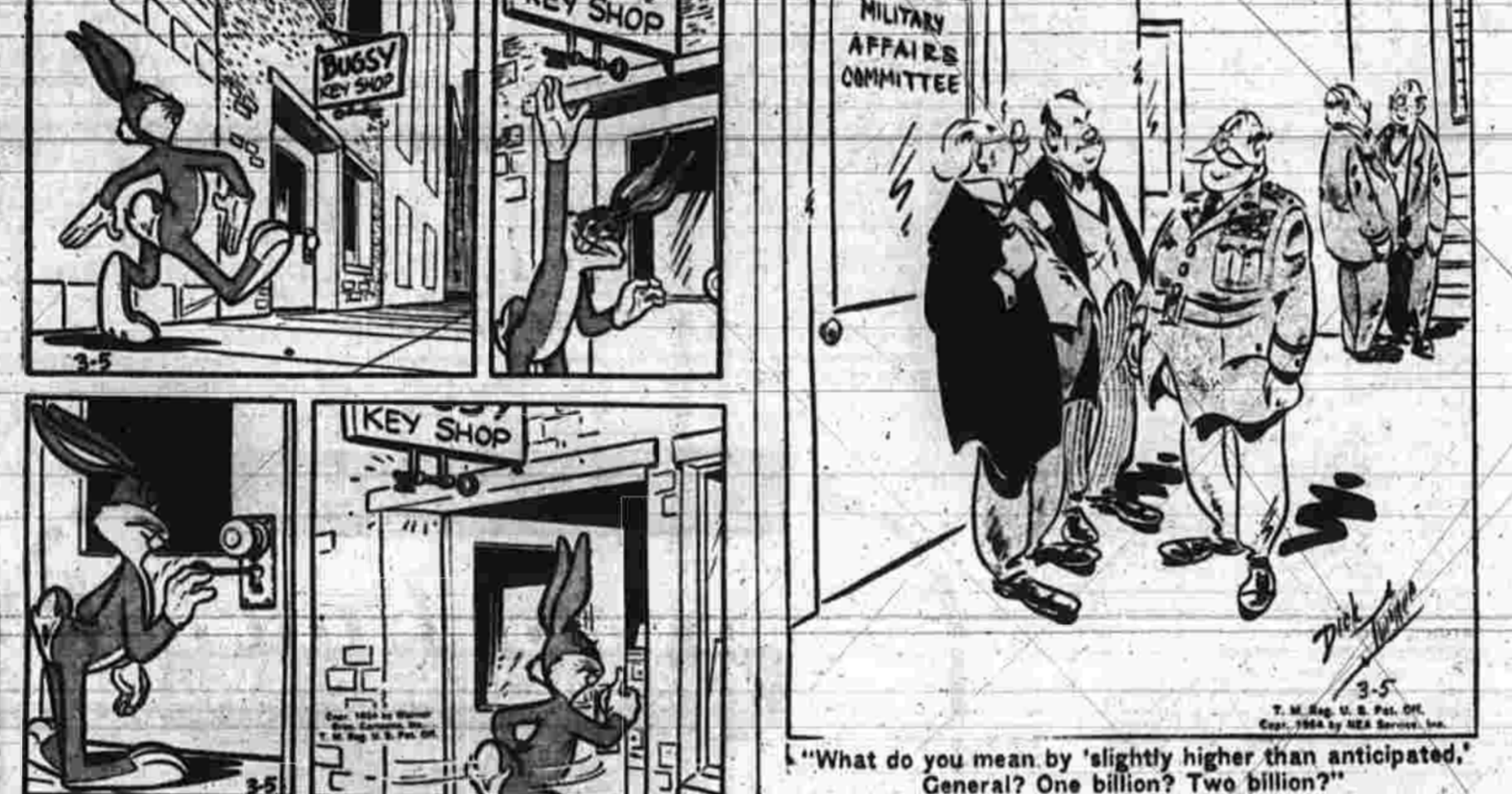

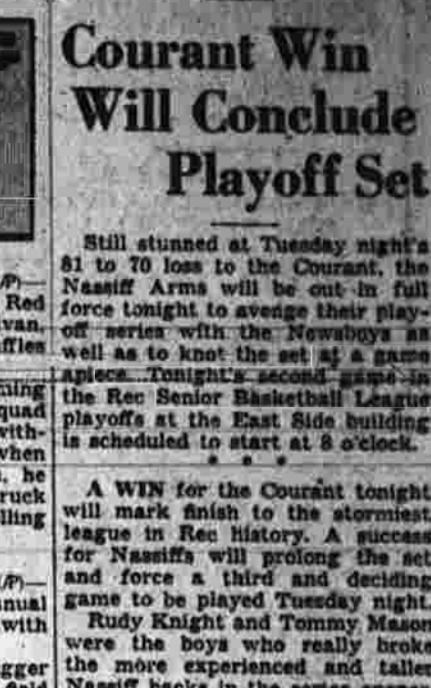
