Without contest a slate of 88 candidates was elected as the new GOP Town Committee.

Avon, where the move to bring the caucus forward was led by Sen. and McCarthy to a head started, voted 250 to 1 in favor of Eisenhower. The resolution said "we believe that the anti-administration forces upon all Republicans a choice may be between the Senator and the President."

Resolutions of a similar nature were adopted by a margin of 8 to 1 in Sharon, 5 to 1 in Salisbury, by a large majority, of the 42 attending the Cornwall caucus, 24 to 5 in Norfolk, and 20 to 0 in Canaan.

New Canaan approved the resolution in support of Eisenhower without mentioning McCarthy.

Keat and Scotland voted to take no action on Eisenhower-McCarthy resolution.

Only 24 hours before the caucus, Republican State Chairman Charles F. Baldwin said that McCarthy poses no threat to the President's leadership, and said it was Democrats who chiefly are promoting this so-called split in the GOP National Committee.

Medea Aizon advised earlier in the week against action on any McCarthy-Eisenhower resolutions.

Sen. and McCarthy are the largest of those whose actions are being discussed.

In the Township School Hall, before television cameras and radio microphones, the Republicans gave a resounding voice to adopt the resolution.

John Aiso, an Eisenhower supporter in 1952 and leader of the movement for passage of the resolution, said before the voting that he believed the "McCarthy attacks" on the administration will continue "unless Republicans clearly state the nation makes it clear they want it stopped."

Television and radio crews missed the first vote on the resolution and the Republicans voted again. This time it was unanimous for the President. However, Town Chairman Roger Rudder said the first vote of 200 to 1 was official.

Only one Avon Republican spoke out against the resolution. He was former State Representative Fike Wentz who said:

"I'm for Eisenhower 100 per cent but I'm also for what McCarthy is doing."

When it came time to vote, however, Wentz remained silent. There are about 1,000 registered Republicans in this town of 3,171. Only registered party members were allowed to vote.

This was the text of the resolution:

"That this caucus endorses the Eisenhower leadership record, program and that this caucus believes that they constitute the best and major basis for the electorate in November, and that we believe that the anti-administration tactics of Senator McCarthy are forcing upon all Republicans a choice between the Senator and the President, the one or the other, and that this caucus makes the choice and Avon chooses Eisenhower."
